Each student studies with one of our distinguished faculty on their primary instrument while taking classes in music theory and music history. Music education majors benefit from a comprehensive degree program, preparing them to be certified teachers in the public school system. NSU boasts many recognized and distinguished band directors and music teachers in the great state of Louisiana, Texas and across the United States.

Auxiliary units including the Demon Heat Colorguard and Demon Dazzler Danceline, add flavor and dimension to the band. These groups also branch out in to our Demon Heat Winterguard and in national competitions with our danceline.

Other ensembles include the Wind Symphony, Wind Ensemble, Concert Bands, Jazz Orchestra, Jazz Combos, Percussion Ensemble, and the Purple Haze Basketball Band, allowing students to perform in a variety of ensembles throughout the year.

Performance scholarships are available to all band members. The amount of the award is based on a prepared audition as well as high school achievements, such as participation in honor bands, solo/ensemble competitions, awards and scholastic scores. Out-of-state fee waivers are available for students qualifying for a performance scholarship and who have a 2.5 minimum high school GPA.
