

Child and Family Studies (CFS) Concentration Options

Child Development and Family Relations (CDFR)

This concentration is ideal for students who want to pursue a career in working with children in an educational setting. **A degree in CFS does not lead to teacher licensure.**

- Coursework in this concentration focuses on child development, the preschool classroom, working with parents, professionalism in the profession, family management, and family cultures
- Can be completed 100% online
- Requires an internship
- 120 hours total

Consumer Services (CS)

This concentration is best suited for students who are interested in starting or operating a business related to children and families.

- While the majority of coursework centers on child and family studies, students also take courses focused on business, finance, leadership, management, marketing, personnel supervision, and staffing.
- Can be completed 100% online
- Requires an internship
- 120 hours total
