## Admission to Candidacy for a Degree in Teacher Education

Admission to Candidacy for a degree in Teacher Education is a formal step in the teacher preparation process. Requirements associated with this step are designed to provide evidence that can be used to assess the students' potential for success in a teaching career.

<u>Teacher education majors must be admitted to candidacy for a degree in teacher education prior to enrolling in</u> <u>courses which require admission to teacher candidacy.</u> Students should complete an application form for admission to candidacy. The applications are available in Pod B of the Teacher Education Center. Requirements for admission to candidacy are checked when the application is submitted.

<u>Requirements for admission to candidacy for a degree in teacher education:</u>

1. Complete EDUC 2020 or MUED 2020 and all first year courses, as defined by the catalog in effect the semester the student enrolls as an education major.

2. Have a 2.5 overall GPA. (A minimum 2.50 is also required for RETENTION in Teacher Candidacy.)

- 3. Complete each of the following with a grade of C or better:
  - a. Courses used to satisfy the University core requirements.
  - b. Degree-applicable professional education courses.
  - c. Degree-applicable specialized academic courses.

(A minimum grade of C is also required for RETENTION in teacher candidacy.)

4. Achieve at least the minimum required scores on the following PRAXIS CORE tests:

<u>Reading</u> # 5712, passing score: 156; <u>Writing</u> # 5722, passing score: 162; and <u>Math</u> # 5732; passing score: 150.

NOTE: STUDENTS WHO EARNED AN <u>ACT</u> COMPOSITE SCORE OF AT LEAST 22 OR A <u>SAT</u> COMBINED READING AND MATH SCORE OF AT LEAST 1030 ARE EXEMPT FROM TAKING THE PRAXIS READING, WRITING, AND MATHEMATICS TESTS.

5. Receive a favorable Evaluation of Candidate.

College of Education candidates will be evaluated while enrolled in Professional Education courses. The evaluations will be posted by the instructors to your TASKSTREAM account. Your instructor will assess your professional skills and dispositions as seen during classes, discussions, assignments, assessments and field experiences. One favorable evaluation is required for admission to Teacher Candidacy.

6. Submit a positive background check.

7. Initiate and complete an application form for admission to candidacy.

NOTE: The Louisiana Department of Education WILL NOT certify persons who have been convicted of a felony.
