

TEACH Grant

Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education

Awards:

Up to \$4,000 per year (4 years for undergraduate programs; 2 years for graduate programs)

Programs:

Undergraduate Programs

- Early Childhood, Grades PK-3
- Elementary Education, Grades 1-5
- Secondary Education, English, Grades 6-12

Graduate Programs (MAT)

- Early Childhood Education Pre K-3
- Elementary Education Grades 1-5
- Middle School Education Grades 4-8

Graduate Programs (MED)

- English, Second Language
- Reading Education
- Special Education-Gifted

- Secondary Education, Mathematics, Grades 6-12
- Secondary Education, Social Studies, Grades 6-12

Requirements:

- Teach full time for 4 years
- Teach In high-need subjects
- Teach in schools that serve low-income students
- Teach as a highly-qualified teacher

Eligibility:

- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 and maintain during program
- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Be admitted into the Undergraduate(Teacher Candidacy), Master of Arts in Teaching or Master of Education program as listed above.

Next Steps:

- Complete FASA and NSU data form
- Complete NSU TEACH Grant Request Form annually
- Complete TEACH Grant counseling with Department of Education <u>https://studentloans.gov/myDirectLoan/index.action</u>
- Sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve and Promise to Pay every year with the US Department of Education **Fulfillment**:
- Documentation of service must be provided by school's chief administrative office upon completion of four years
- FAILURE TO COMPLETE TEACHING OBLIGATION OR PROPERLY DOCUMENT SERVICE WILL CAUSE THE TEACH GRANT TO BE PERMANENTLY CONVERTED TO AN UNSUBSIDIZED FEDERAL DIRECT STAFFORD LOAN WITH INTEREST
