

ADMISSION CRITERIA

IN-STATE, OUT OF STATE AND HOME SCHOOLED STUDENTS must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Meet Regents' Core Curriculum (Core 4)
- 2. Earn 2.35 minimum high school GPA

3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English and 19/500 or 25 in Math *Contact your recruiter to find out how you can be admissible.*

OUT-OF-STATE AND HOME SCHOOLED STUDENTS can also be admitted by the following admission requirements:

- 1. Complete 17 of the 19 units of the Regents' Core Curriculum
- 2. Earn 2.35 minimum overall high school GPA
- 3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English and 19/500 or 25 in Math
- 4. Earn a 2.0 minimum core GPA

<u>OR</u>

1. ACT composite score of 23

(SAT combined math and critical reading score of 1050)

- 2. Have a minimum overall high school GPA of 2.35
- 3. ACT/SAT scores: 18/25-33 in English and 19/500 or 25 in Math *Contact your recruiter to find out how you can be admissible.*

*Students not meeting above criteria may be admitted on exception.



Shreveport-Bossier: *Louisiana's Other Side* is a metropolitan area of about 350,000 people. It is ideally situated in northwest Louisiana about 15 minutes from the Texas border on the west and 30 minutes from the Arkansas border on the north.

The Red River connects the two cities and since Shreveport's early inception, the riverfront has served as the hub of the city's commercial life. What began life as a log-jammed river port has now become home to a splendid convention center, five riverboat casinos, year-round festivals and a riverfront shopping/ dining/entertainment venue.
