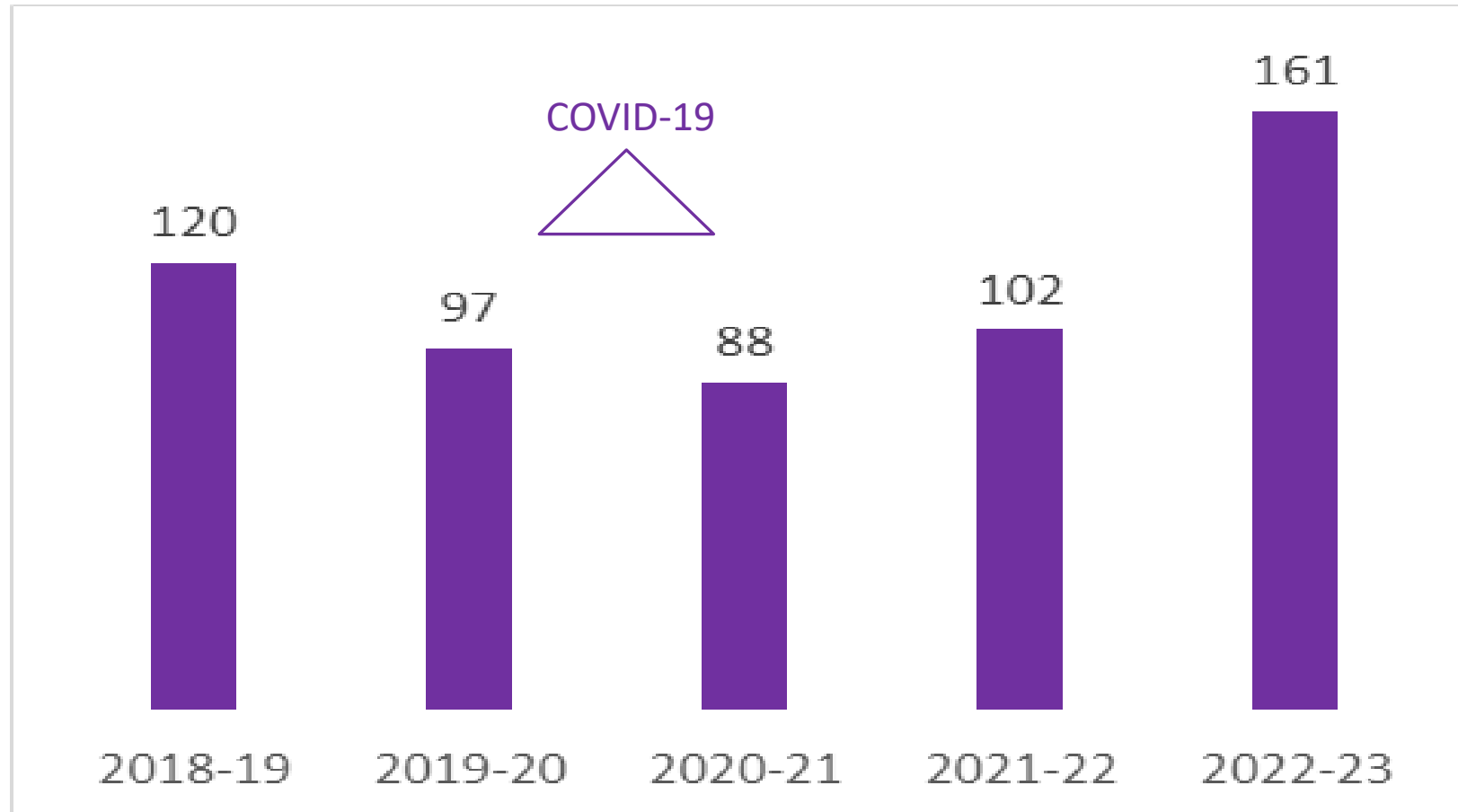

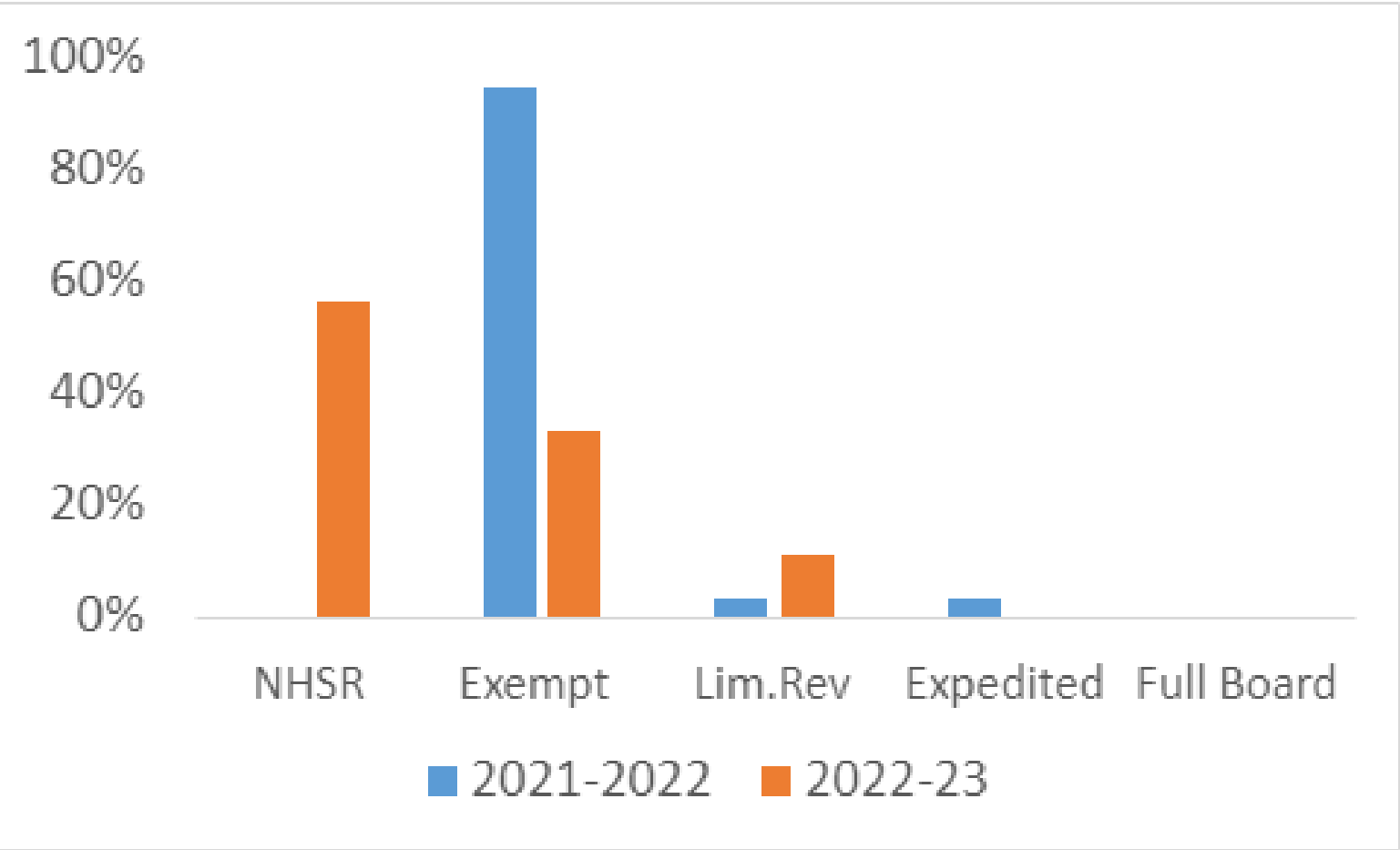


IRB Apps by Academic Year, 2018-2023



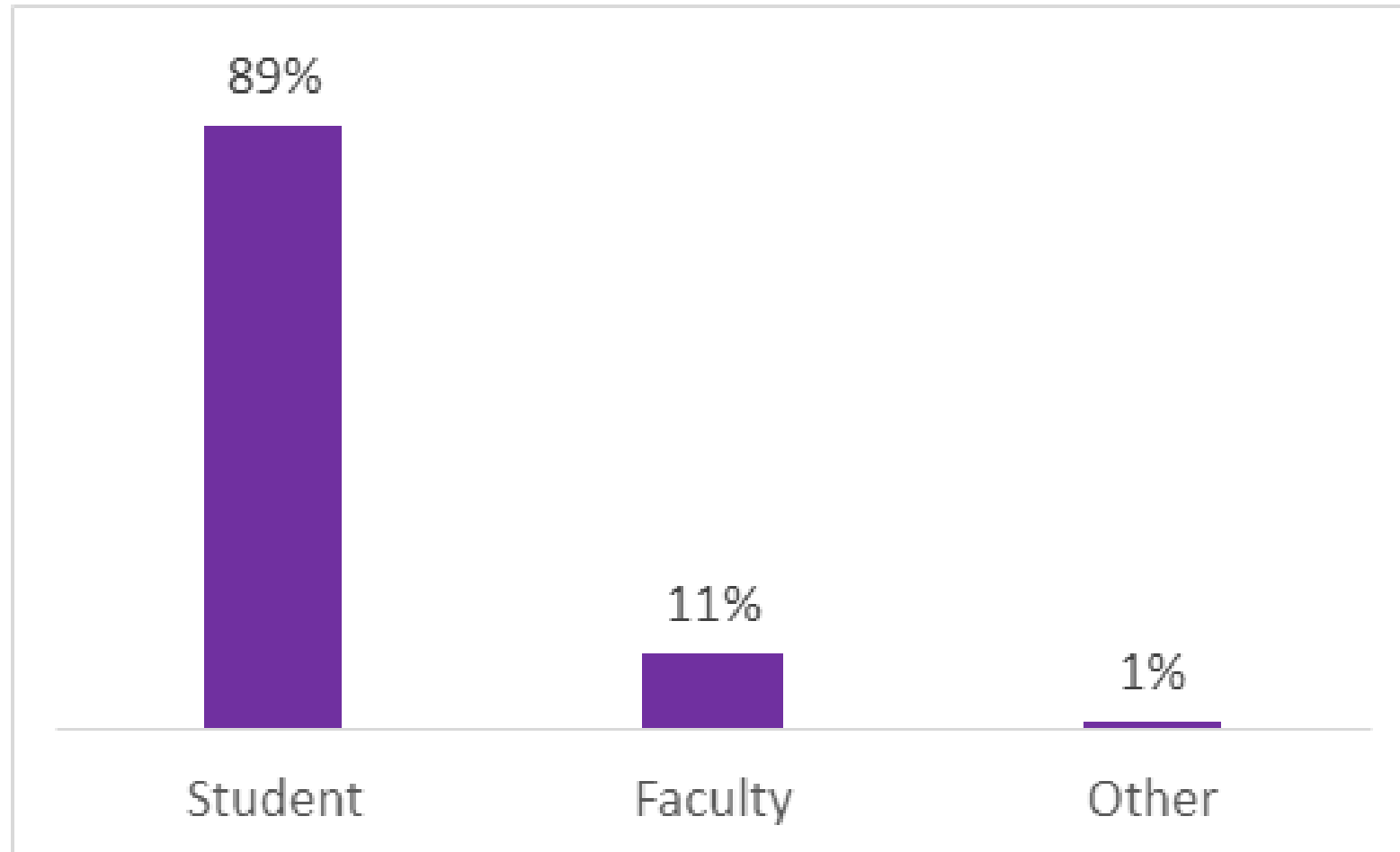


IRB Apps by Initial Review Category, 2021-22 & 2022-23

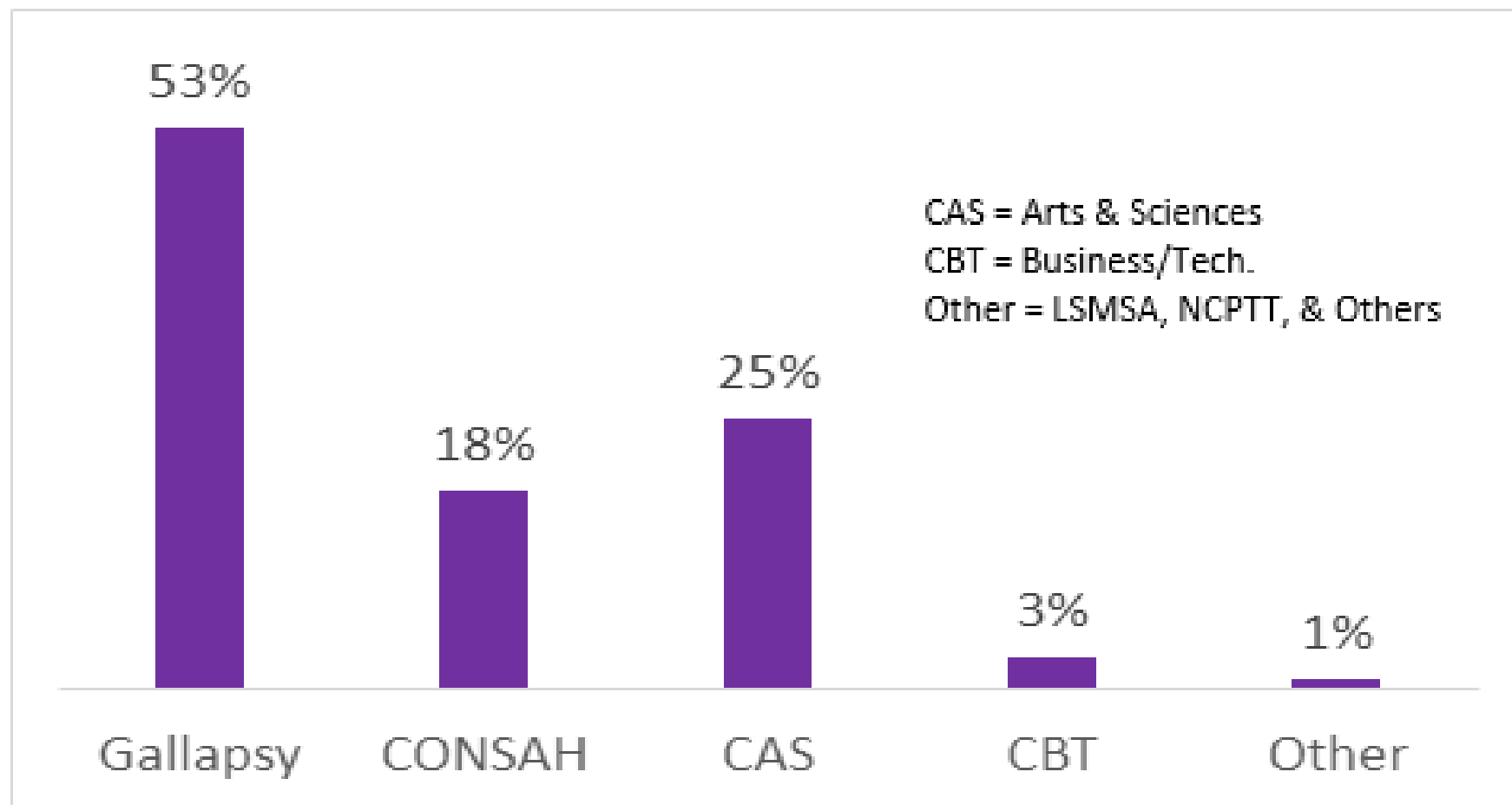




IRB Apps by PI Type, 2022-2023

Conclusions: IRB Activity, 2022-2023*

A. App Totals

- ❖ Total applications (including those Not Completed or Withdraw) = 161, a 57% increase from 2021-22.
- ❖ NHSR reviews constituted the largest review category, with 56% of all application *approvals* (0% in 2021-22).
- ❖ Exempt approvals decreased to 33% in 2022-23 (90% in 2021-22).
- ❖ 19% of all applications *submitted* (1 in 5) were Not Completed or Withdrawn from the review process.



Conclusions: IRB Activity, 2022-2023*

B. App Origination

❖ Per PI Type:

- 89 of every 100 applications are submitted by student researchers.
- Faculty applications increased slightly (1%).

❖ Per NSU College:

- All four Colleges submitted IRB applications (same as the previous year).
- Arts & Sciences (CAS) approvals increased to 25% of total approved (9% in 2021-22), largely due to NHSR approvals—49% came from CAS (41% from CONSAH).

❖ The future (2023-24):

- IRB applications activity will continue to increase, though likely not as much as 2022-23.
- NHSR reviews will continue to increase, lowering application submission and review time and providing researchers more time on their studies.
