Last academic year, there were 15 graduates of Northwestern State University's Counseling Program. Ten graduates were from the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Concentration; 5 graduates were from the School Counseling Concentration. Graduates in the Clinical Mental Health Concentration are required to pass the NCE in order to obtain full licensure as an LPC, but they have a period of two years as a provisionally licensed counselor before they are required to sit for the exam. Not all graduates take the NCE prior to graduation. These numbers are based on self-report.

Graduates in the School Counseling concentration are required to take the School Counseling PRAXIS exam for certification as a School Counselor.

Of the admitted students in this cohort, 100% graduated from the program in the expected time period and 100% of those program graduates who were actively seeking jobs are employed (based on student self-reports).
