Northwestern State University's Master of Science Degree in Homeland Security (HS) is designed to provide an analysis and understanding of the emerging challenges of globalization and our "new world order" and sensitive balance between constitutional issues and homeland security; network security, cyberwarfare, cyberforensics, and countermeasures. Program is 30 or 36 hours.

The Homeland Security degree is most apropos in today's environment. The constant threat of terrorist attacks at home and abroad, the advanced technology utilized, and the requirement to be ever vigilant demands that training and education be "cutting edge" in order to neutralize the threats facing the United States and the world. The in Homeland Security degree will provide the requisite training to counter these threats.



Military Financial Options

Northwestern State University is dedicated to working with military students and dependents to ensure a smooth process. Our military financial options include a competitive tuition rate of \$192 per credit hour for active duty, reservist, retirees, and their dependents. Fee Exemption for Law Enforcement Officers & Public Safety Personnel

Northwestern State University offers fee exemption for commissioned full-time law enforcement or public safety officers, which include firemen and EMS personnel. Undergraduate students may enroll in no more than 9 semester hours and Graduate students may enroll in no more than 6 semester hours at the reduced rate. Additional hours will be at the standard tuition rate.
