The Master of Education (M.Ed.) program in Curriculum and Instruction with a concentration in instructional design are for those seeking additional training to become curriculum specialists with a design focus.

Prerequisites for this program include a valid teaching license as well as admission to the graduate school.

Degree requirements for this program and concentration include 12 hours of foundation coursework; 9 hours of support and application coursework; and 15 hours of concentration coursework.
