## History of NSU

Northwestern State University (NSU) is a regional comprehensive public university in Natchitoches, Louisiana. NSU is committed to providing an education of enduring value through dynamic academic programs and meaningful partnerships that prepare learners with the hands-on experience, innovative skills, and foundational knowledge necessary to build a better tomorrow. A degree from NSU delivers higher earning potential and more educational attainment opportunities that meet the primary drivers of workforce demand.

Northwestern State University of Louisiana stands on ground that has been dedicated to learning for well over a hundred years. Prior to the Civil War a portion of the present campus was the property of the Bullard family of Natchitoches. As early as 1856 the Bullard mansion was in use as a convent by the Religious of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The following year a school building was erected at the convent, and in 1884 the property was purchased by the town and parish of Natchitoches. Three of the four great white columns that once supported the east gable of the Bullard mansion still stand on “The Hill” and often serve as the unofficial symbol of the University.

The State Legislature by Act 51 of 1884 created a Louisiana State Normal School for the preparation of teachers. A member of the Legislature, Leopold Caspari, offered the convent site as a campus for the School with the anticipated approval of the citizens of Natchitoches. The offer was accepted, and from 1885 to 1918 the Normal School offered two years of study for the training of teachers. Baccalaureate programs were then inaugurated, and the State Constitution adopted in 1921 changed the name of the school to Louisiana State Normal College.

The resources and curricula of “Normal” grew steadily to meet the increasingly diverse requirements of Louisiana’s expanding population. In 1944 the institution’s excellent service in

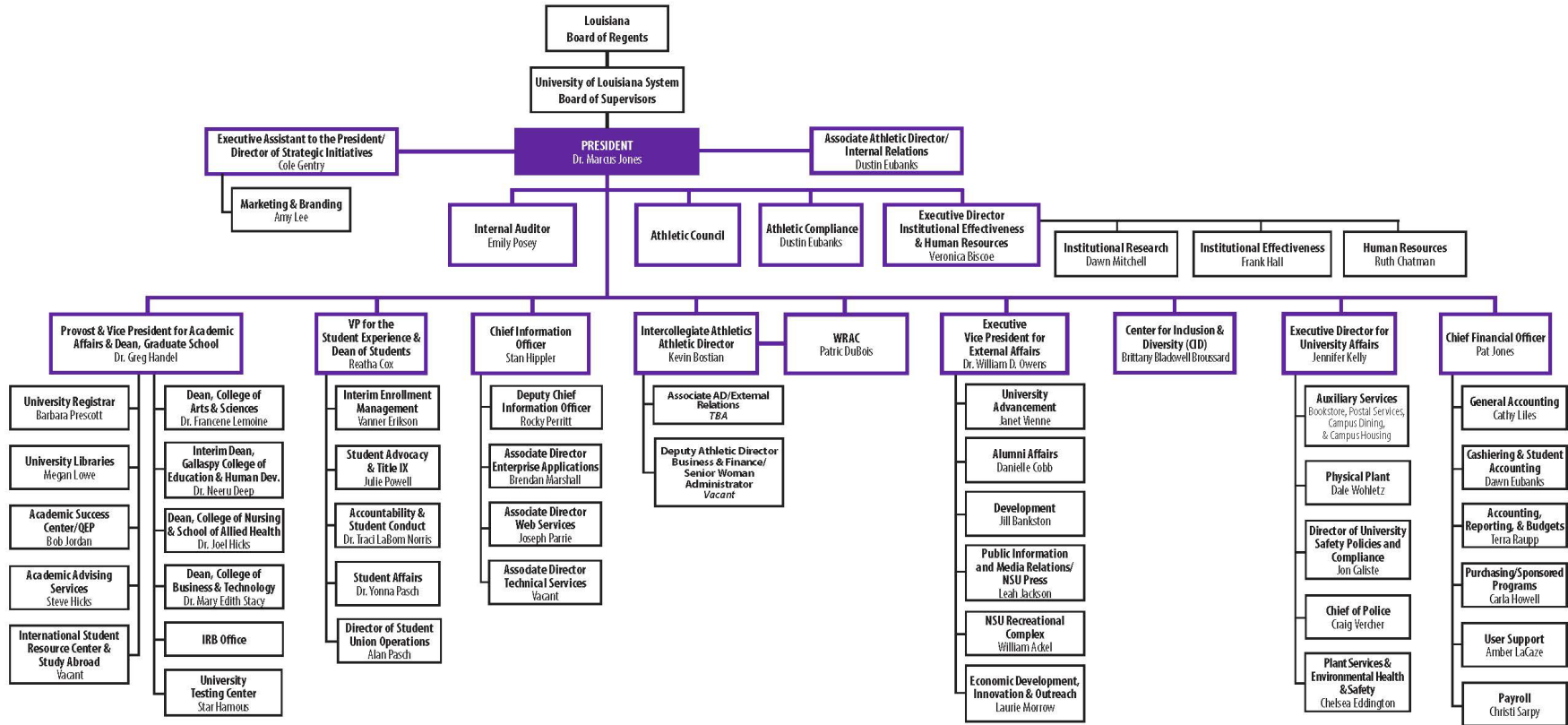
its broader role was accorded formal recognition in Act 326 of the Legislature, which changed its name to Northwestern State College of Louisiana.

Northwestern maintained and strengthened its long tradition of leadership in public service and academic endeavor and became, in 1954, the first college under the jurisdiction of the Louisiana State Board of Education to offer the Master's degree. The Educational Specialist degree was first offered in 1966.

On June 18, 1970, Governor John J. McKeithen signed the legislative act which brought the old school its greatest distinction by changing its title to Northwestern State University of Louisiana.

In 1980 the old campus quadrangle where the columns stand was entered into the National Register of Historic Places under the title "Normal Hill Historic District."

In 1984 Northwestern State University celebrated its Centennial with lectures, concerts, social events, and an effective fund-raising effort that established the Centennial Development Fund. Academic programs are provided at the main campus in Natchitoches, as well as instructional sites in Shreveport, Bossier City, Alexandria, Leesville, Marksville, and eNSU online.

## Accreditation

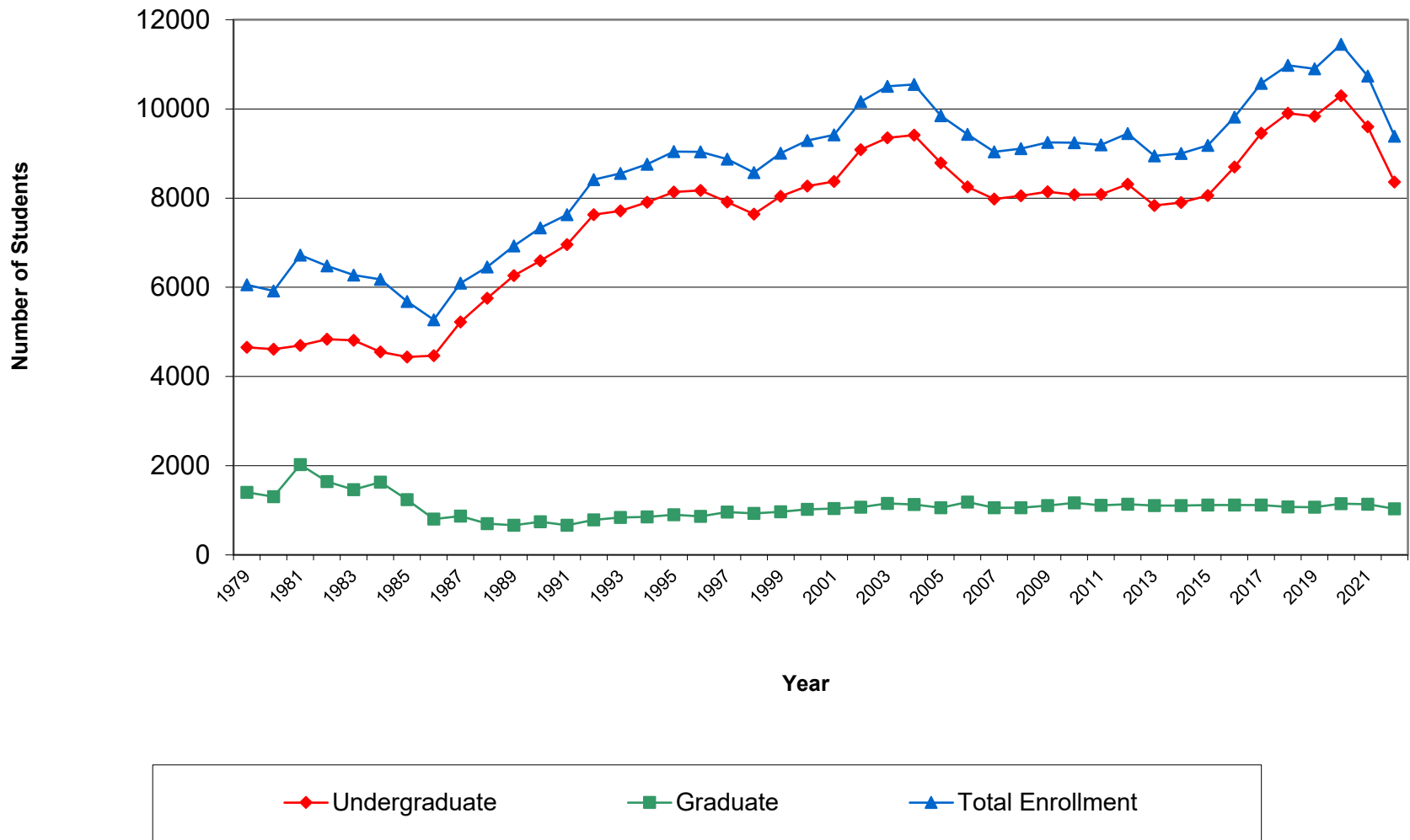

Fall 1980 to Fall 2022 Enrollment

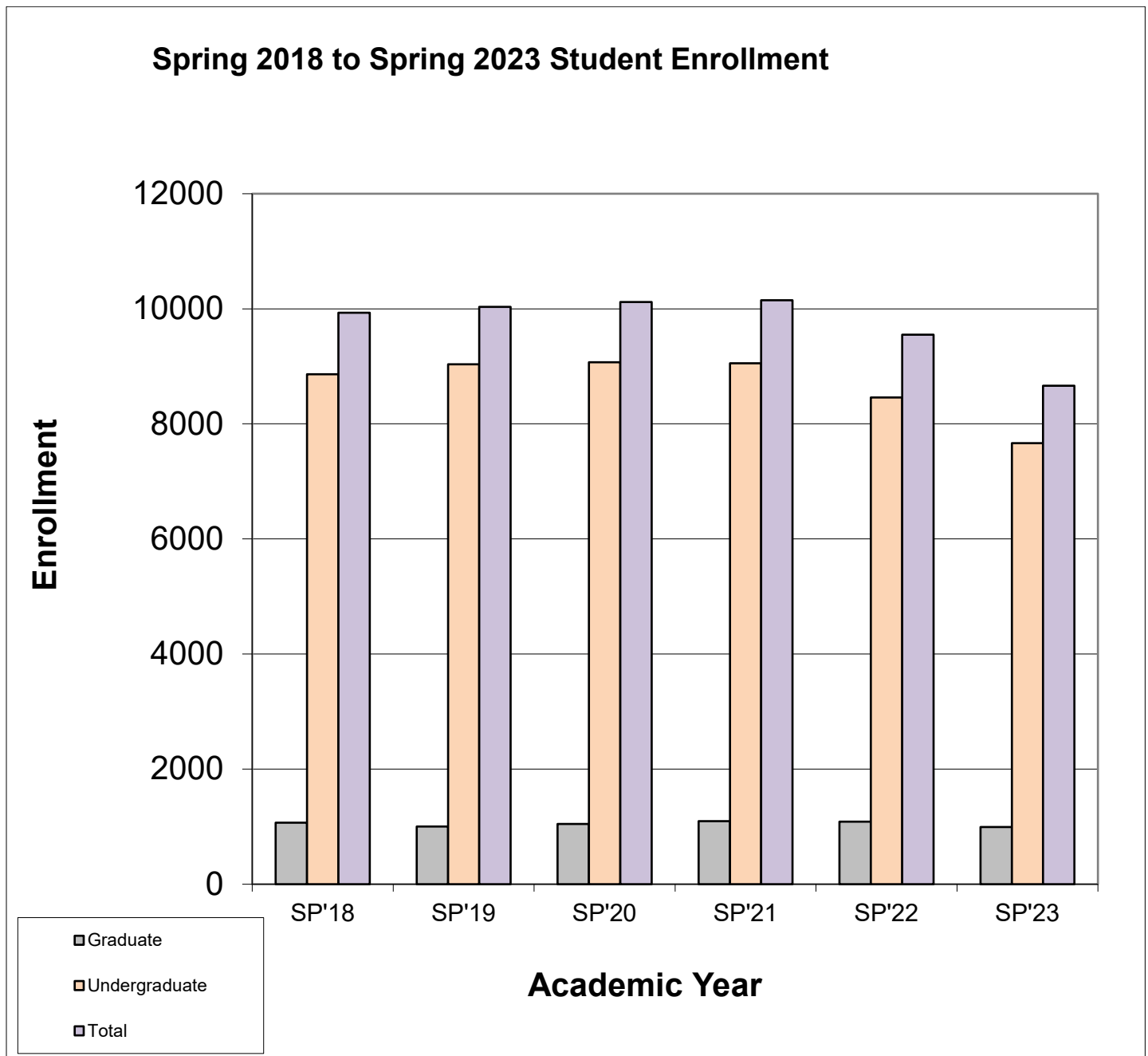

## Graduate And Undergraduate Enrollment From Fall 1979 To Fall 2022



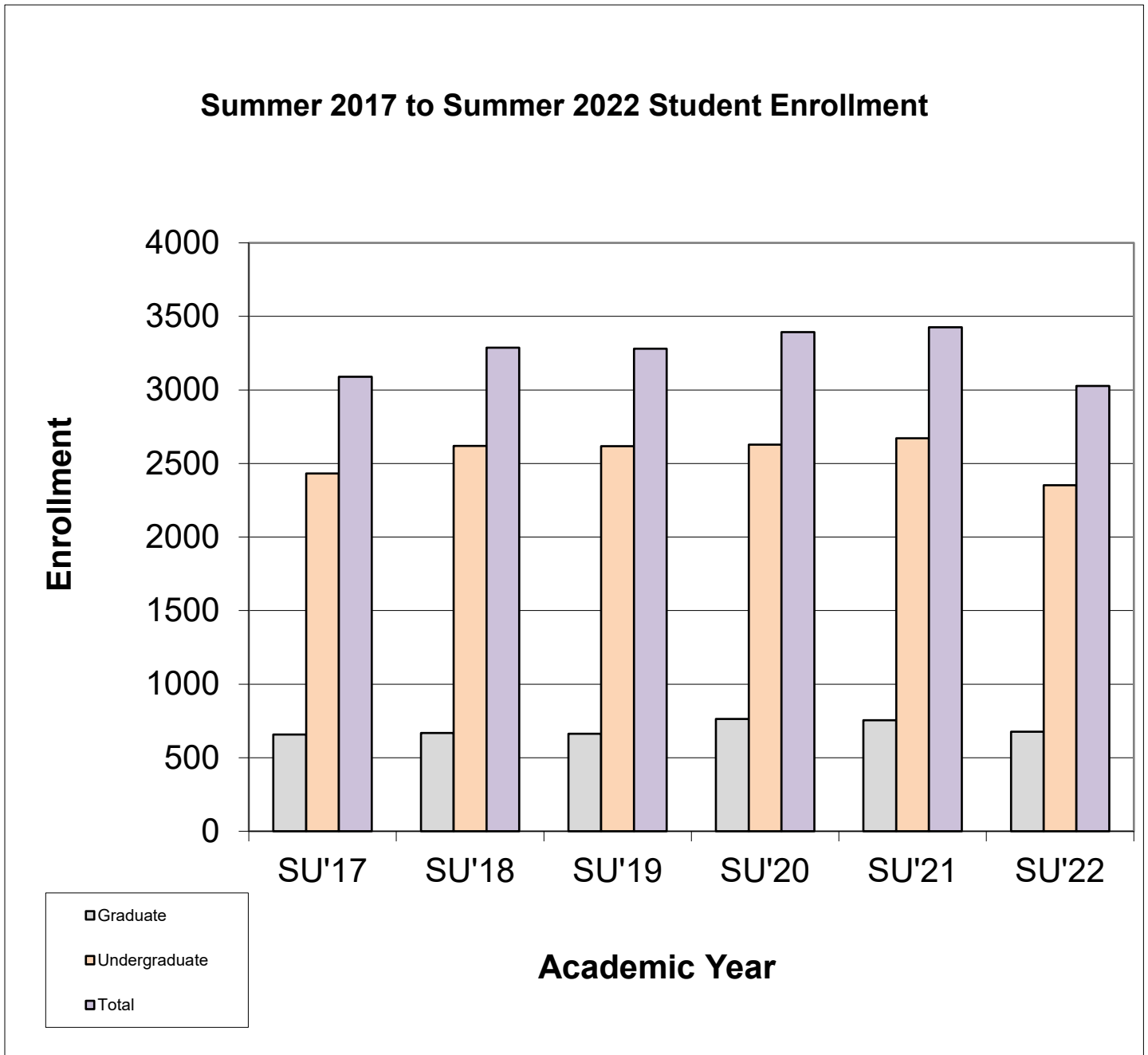

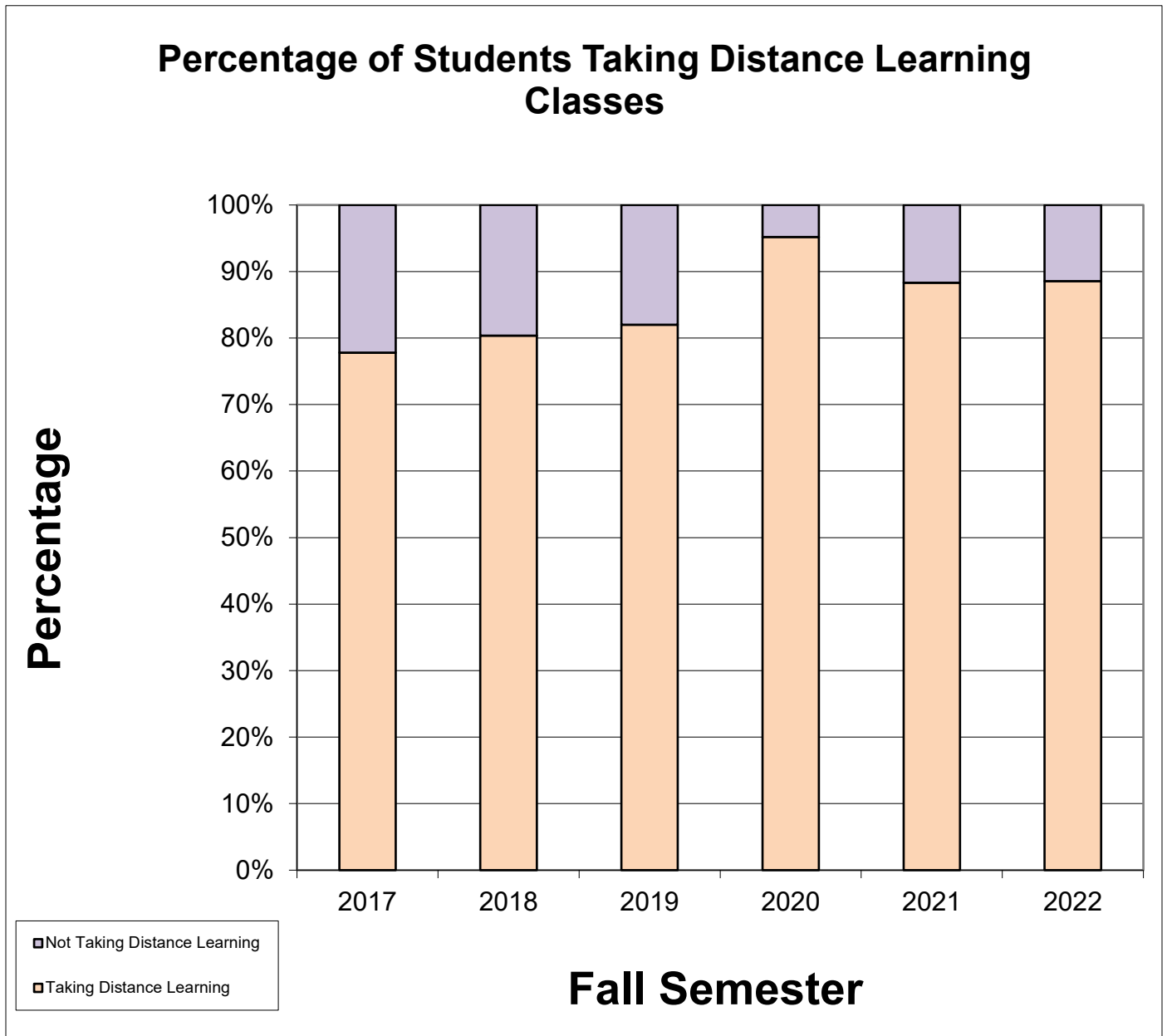

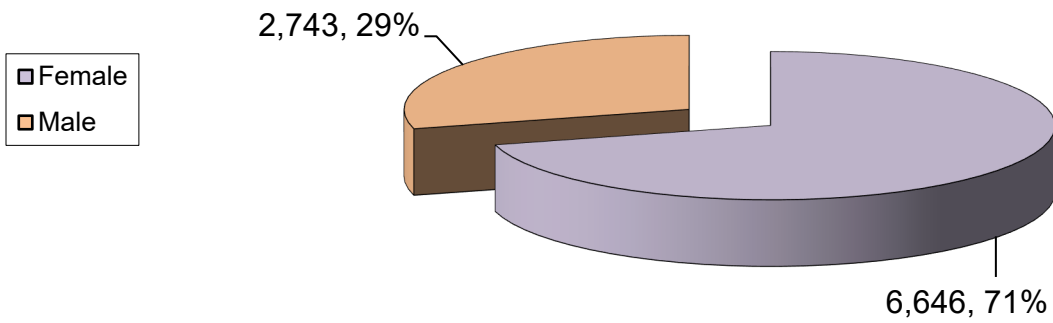

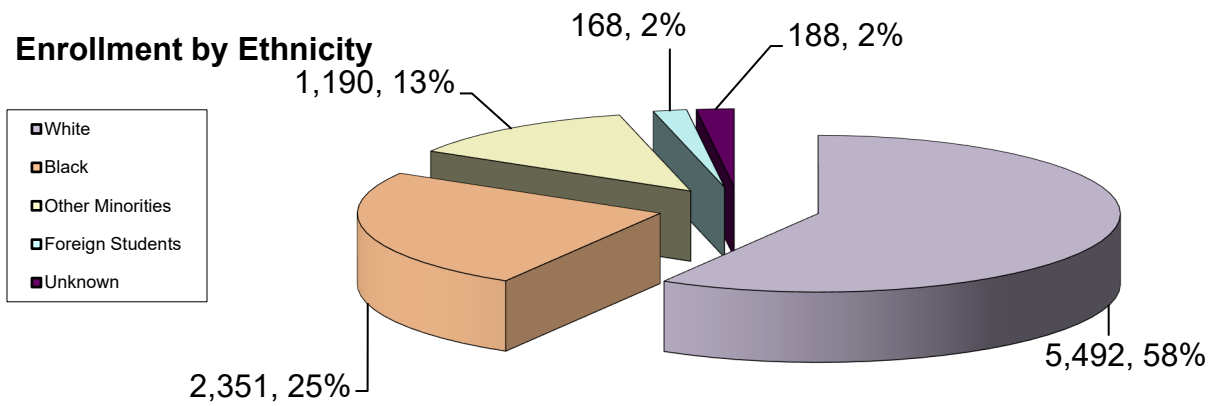

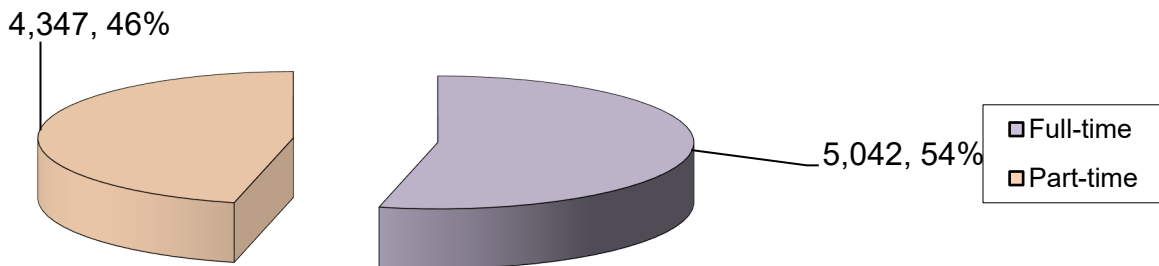
## University Snapshot Enrollment by Gender



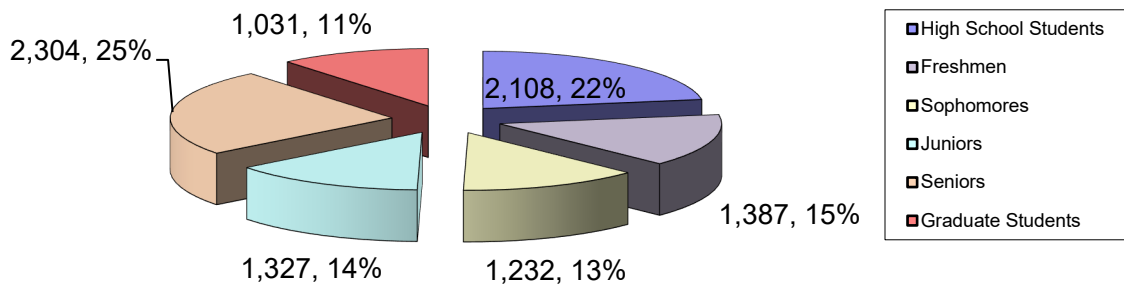
## Enrollment by Ethnicity

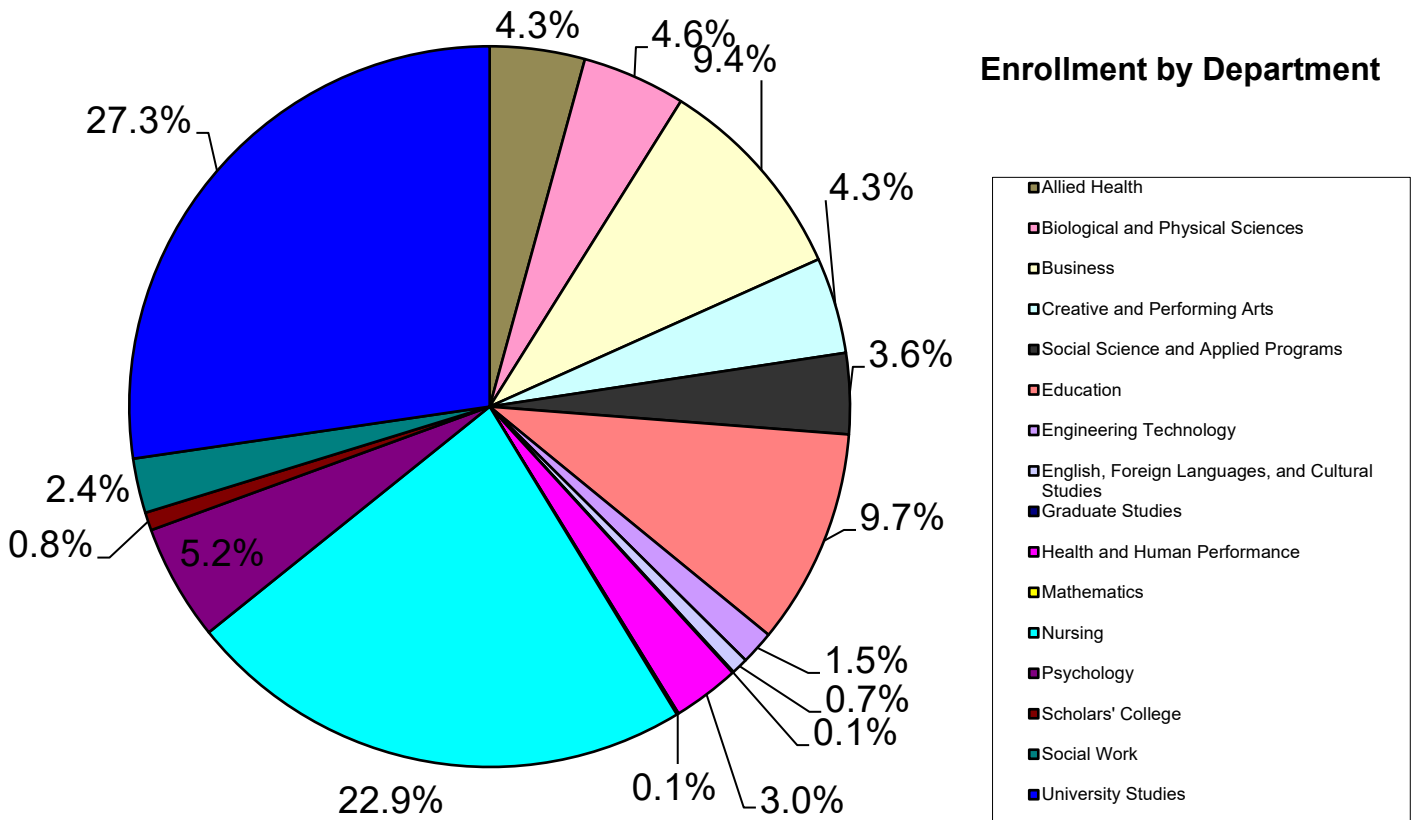

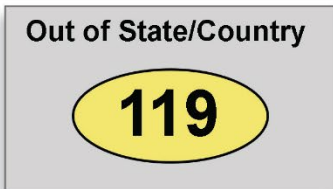
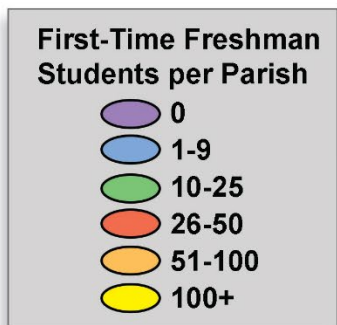
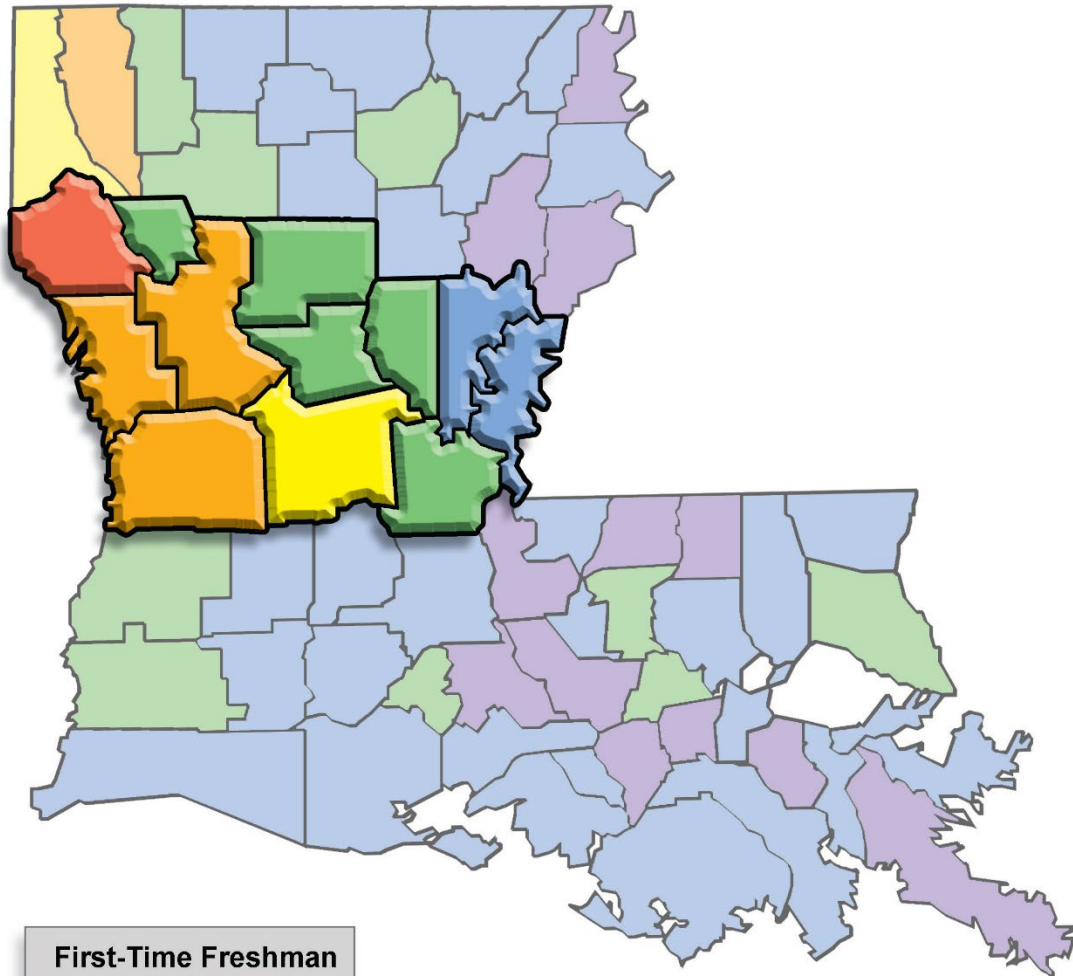
## Map of Louisiana—Number of Students Enrolled by Parish

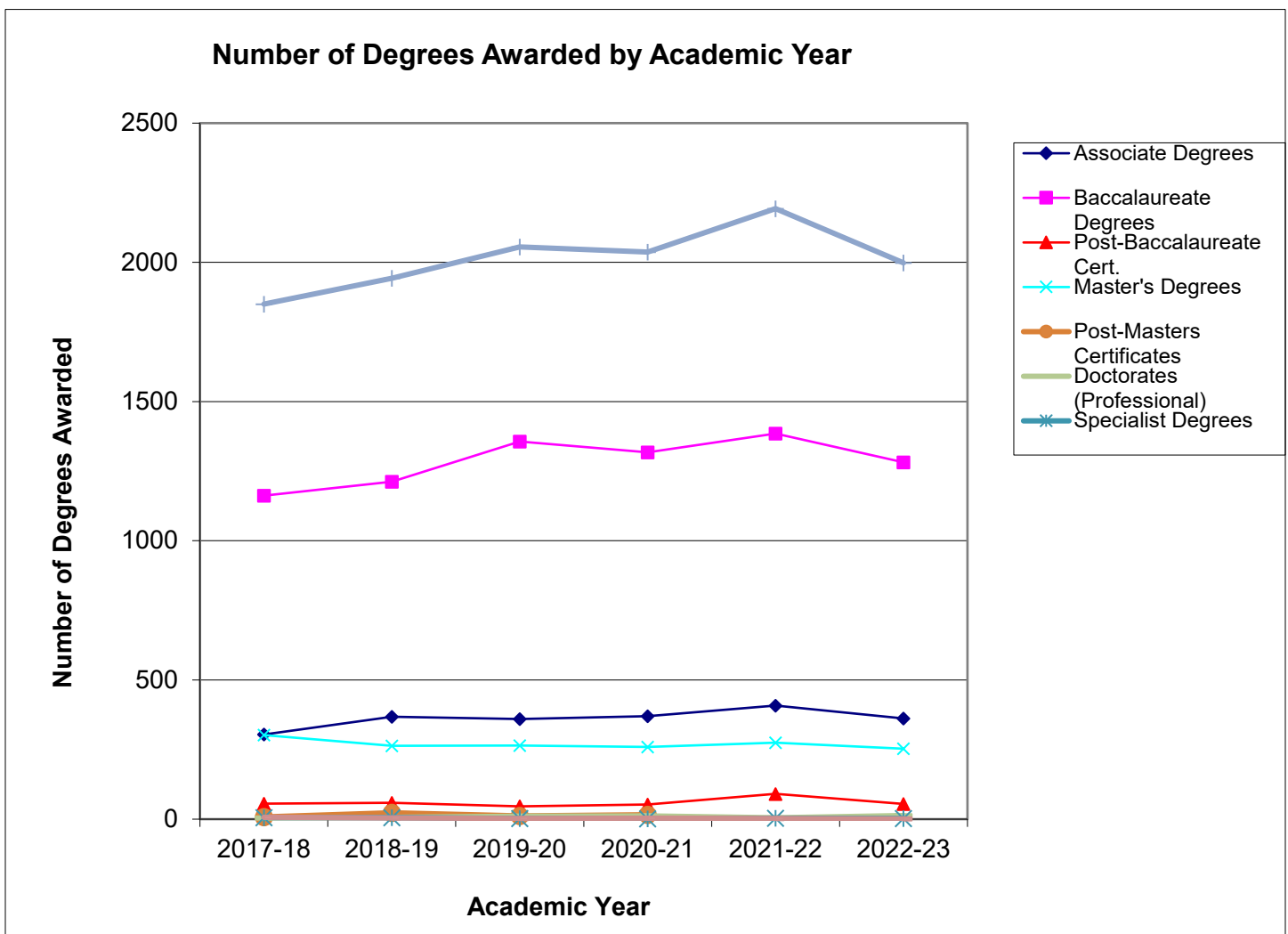
### Fall 2022 First-time Freshman Student Demographics by Parish as of 14-day count

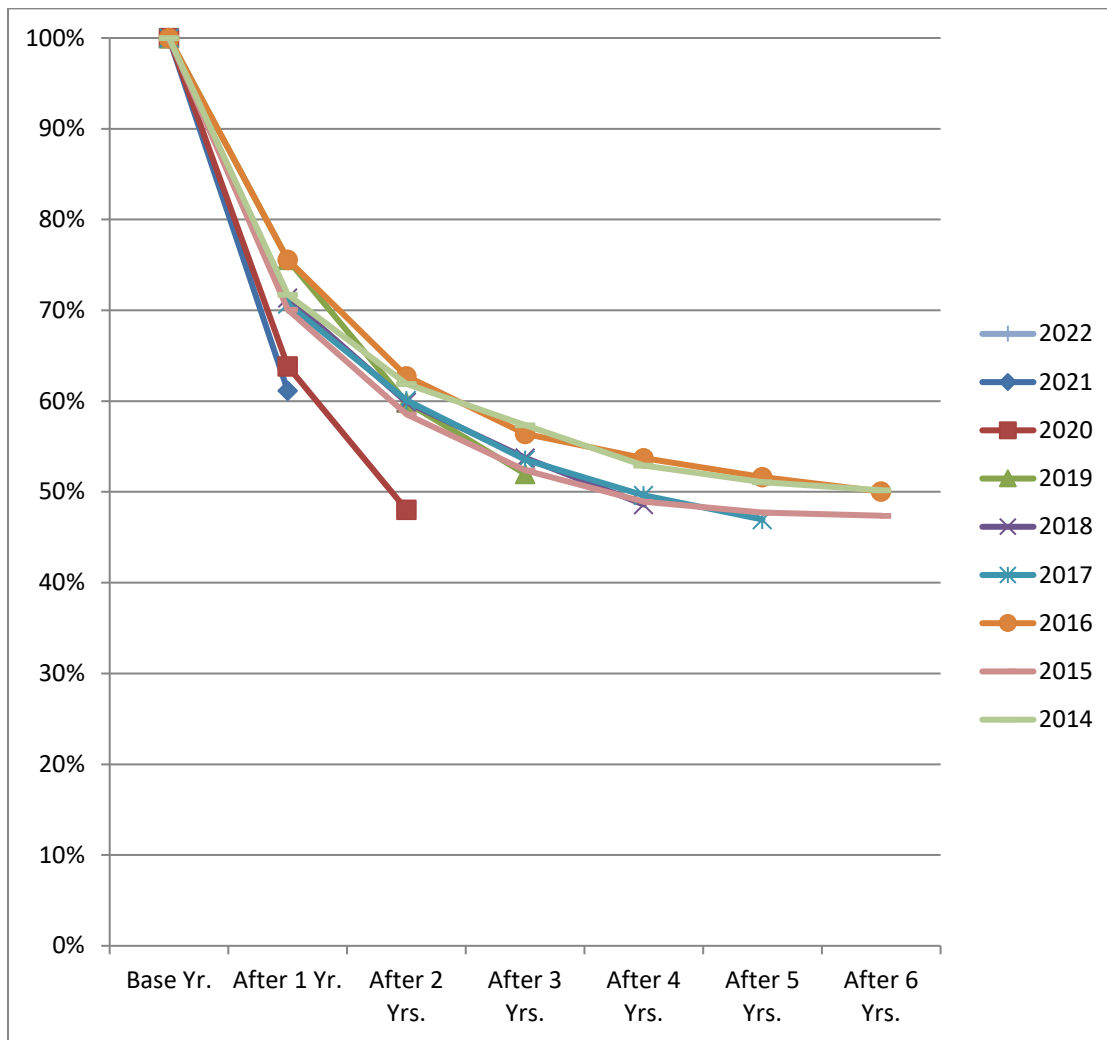

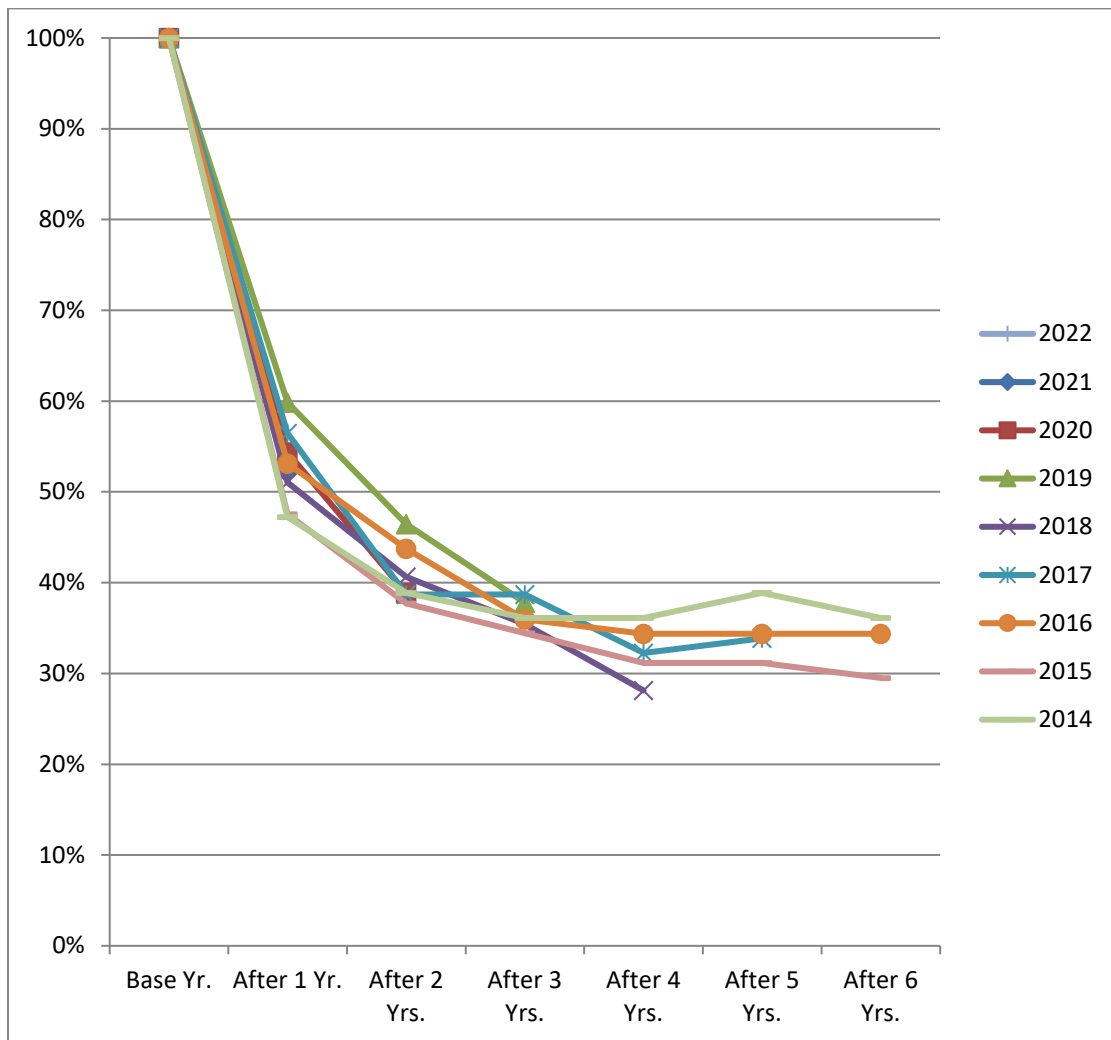

All Northwestern students, faculty, and staff have access to over 100 electronic databases of scholarly and popular research resources. These resources are available 24/7/365 remotely through University Libraries' website: [library.nsula.edu](http://library.nsula.edu). Located on the main campus, the Eugene P. Watson Memorial Library is a three-story modular 95,000-sq. ft. building containing facilities for group and individual study, research, and instruction. Professional librarians are available to assist with research both face-to-face and remotely. The Reference Room and Stacks (the circulating collection) are on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. The library administration office and Serials/Media Department are on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. The Cammie G. Henry Research Center is located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor as well and houses University Archives, special collections, and the Louisiana Collection. Watson Library also houses the Academic Success Center, a computer lab, and the Café DeMon Coffee Shop, all on the first floor.

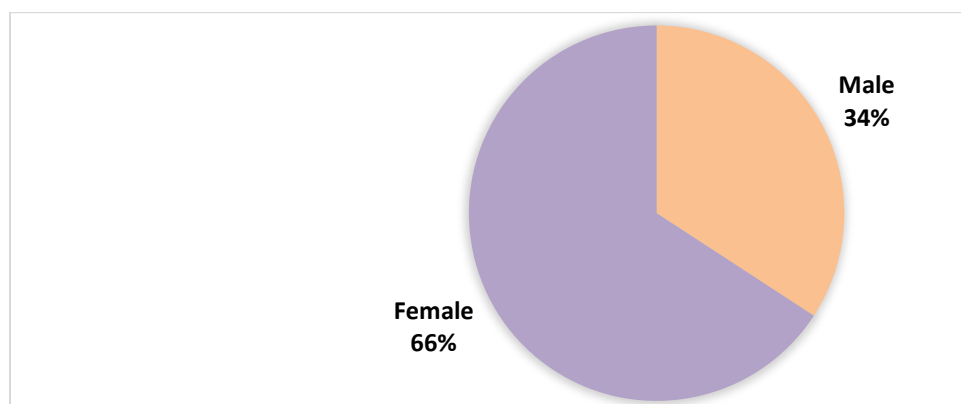

### **On-Campus Housing Policy**

According to the rules of the Board of Supervisors of the University of Louisiana System, an unmarried full-time undergraduate student is required to live on campus if space is available, unless exempt by the University for good and reasonable cause.

The University Administration has a responsibility to adhere to the policies of its governing body. Therefore, the University requires an unmarried full-time undergraduate student desiring to reside off campus to receive prior approval and to:

- 1) Live with a verifiable family member (substantiated by statement from parent or guardian).
- 2) Be classified as military veteran (documented by Form DD214).
- 3) Reside in a property owned by student or student's family (substantiated by statement from parent or guardian).
- 4) Have a significant medical problem (documented by physician's statement, which specifically states the condition, which precludes a student from residing in a residence hall).
- 5) Have a significant financial hardship (documented by notarized statement from parents indicating their contribution to cost of student's university expenses, itemized statement from student indicating funds available for expenses and anticipated expenses, copy of student's university expenses and a copy of student's W-2 form for preceding year).
- 6) Be 21 years of age or older
- 7) Have resided on campus for six semesters.
- 8) Be married, divorced (as documented by marriage license or divorce decree) or in guardianship of a dependent child (as documented by a legal documentation).
- 9) Be classified as a senior (90 or more earned semester hours).
- 10) Suffer other significant hardships if required to reside on campus (as documented by a parent or guardian, counselor, academic dean or advisor).

The mission of Northwestern State University's Sponsored Programs Office (SPO) is to nurture and develop the sponsored-programs enterprise at NSU, in accordance with the University's overall mission.

NSU's Sponsored Programs Office provides state-of-the-art information, advice, and assistance to faculty and staff relative to all sponsored programs matters/issues and continuously seeks ways to improve the processes and services it provides. The University encourages its faculty to undertake sponsored, scholarly activities as a means of (a) offering modern instructional programs to students and (b) enhancing the academic stature of the faculty and the University.

On behalf of faculty and staff, SPO submitted fifty-four (54) proposals with a requested dollar amount of \$22,722,696 for the 2022-23 fiscal year. During 2022-23, the University was awarded \$15,992,378 from various federal, state, and private agencies as indicated in the chart below:

## Department of Military Science US Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC)

During the 1950 fall semester, then Northwestern State College (NSC) President H. Lee Prather, with the support of the Department of the Army, established the NSC Senior Reserve Officers' Training Corps. Branch material, anti-aircraft artillery was offered initially. By the end of the academic year, 220 students elected to participate in military training. The program produced its first commissioned officers later that year. The transition to the General Military Science program was completed in June 1955.

On 31 March 1965, a new "Agreement for the Establishment of Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps Unit" was signed by the Department of the Army and NSC President John S. Kyser. Under the terms of this Agreement, NSC contracted to continue its voluntary four-year ROTC program while concurrently offering a two-year course of instruction in military science. Additionally, the college would provide an armory, secretary, and utilities. The armory was later named for Louisiana Governor James A. Noe in thanks for his continued support.

NSU's Department of Military Science and the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana, mutually support US Army Cadet Command by identifying quality Soldiers with officer potential and assisting them in transitioning from the enlisted ranks to officers under the Army's ROTC Green to Gold Program.

The Northwestern Demon Regiment (NDR) was organized on 2 May 2009 to foster a spirit of loyalty, friendship, commitment, and communication among alumni, Cadets, parents, faculty and staff, and other friends of Northwestern and the Department of Military Science. The Regiment has established an Endowed Professorship to help meet the program's financial needs, and it continues to raise funds throughout the year to assist with the annual Military Ball, Staff Ride, tailgating, and other Cadet activities.

Northwestern's ROTC Demon Battalion has commissioned over 1,100 students as Second Lieutenants in the United States armed services, whether on active duty, Army Reserve, or the Army National Guard. Many graduates have become distinguished Army officers, including eight general officers. Notably, five NSU ROTC commissioned officers have been inducted into NSU's highest Hall of Distinction, the Long Purple Line.
