



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

1. Students should complete the deNSU Fast Forward application after applying to deNSU. Contact your high school counselor for QR code.
2. Interested students must have a 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and minimum test scores to pursue the AGS.
3. Once accepted, students will continue to follow their high school's policies when registering for courses.
4. Test scores and transcripts for all non-NSU institutions must be sent directly to the Admissions office.
5. Students will work with their high school counselors and an assigned advisor at NSU to ensure all degree requirements are met for the Associate of General Studies. Find your advisor on the Academic Advising Services website.
6. Eligible students can take up to 16 credit hours per semester in Spring and Fall and must maintain a 2.5 NSU cumulative GPA.
7. In January of the student's graduation year, Academic Advising Services will provide a graduation application that must be filled out and returned.
