Note: You MUST have a valid FAFSA on file in order to receive an approved exception, unless you are an international student. Balances with the Attorney General's Office must also be paid in full.

Important Note: If an exception to register with a previous balance is approved, and you are eligible for financial aid, Northwestern State University will apply your aid in the following ways:

- * Non-title IV aid (such as scholarships, exemptions, and other non federal assistance) will be applied to any balance, current or previous
- * Title IV aid (such as federal direct loans, Parent PLUS loans, PELL, and SEOG) will be applied to any current aid year balance. Title IV aid cannot be used to pay a balance greater than \$200 from a previous aid year. Students with Financial Aid greater than current award year charges will receive a balance check. These students are encouraged to pay any previous award year balance upon receipt of any refund as part of their payment plan documented in their exception plan. Failure to do so may result in future exception being denied.

Installment, late registration, and late payment charges will be assessed and collection placement including any collection cost and credit bureau reporting submitted in accordance with University policy regardless of an approved exception.

According to University policy, all University balances must be paid in full in order for a continuing student to reside in on-campus housing. An approved exception grants access to register for classes, and does not affect a student's housing eligibility.
