The session focused on exploring opportunities to partner, share resources, and strategically plan for

the future of our region. These collaborations will play a vital role in strengthening Northwestern's community ties and advancing our shared goals.

On Wednesday evening, I had the pleasure of addressing the Beacon Society. This remarkable group of alumni and supporters is a key component of our university's success, offering valuable input and ideas that help shape initiatives to benefit Northwestern. Athletics Update

Both basketball teams are out to a great start in Southland Conference competition with 4-1 records in league play. Spring sports teams are already preparing for their seasons. Track and field and women's tennis get started this

month. Fundraising events for softball and baseball are set for the next two Saturday nights. Please check NSUDemons.com for information about upcoming home games and events.

The women's basketball team defeated last year's Southland Conference NCAA Tournament representative Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on the road Thursday. It was the first time in 12 tries for our women to beat the Islanders, who have been one of the Southland standard-bearers for several seasons. Point guard Mya Blake was named last Monday the first Southland Women's Basketball Player of the Week in 2025, and subsequently scored 15 points in the fourth quarter to spark the comeback win at Corpus Christi.

Our men's basketball team continues to excel in close games, most recently holding off East Texas A&M for a conference win at home on Saturday. Coach Rick Cabrera's team has its four wins by a combined total of 17 points, for the program's best five-game record in SLC games since 2013.

Just after Christmas, volleyball coach Sean Kiracofe accepted a job at the University of Central Florida after being part of the Northwestern family for 10 years. We appreciate Sean for his efforts and impact and wish him all the best going forward. A replacement volleyball coach is in the works and will be named soon.
