Chris Maggio:

- Focused on getting new freshman enrolled for the Fall semester.
- ➤ Had 760 students for 1st and 2nd and Shreveport Freshman Connections sessions; have approximately 220 enrolled for the 3rd session on June 23 24. We anticipate having to deal with lack of housing issues in the next two sessions.
- ➤ We have 12 15 incoming traditional freshman that have indicated that they would like to enroll in classes totally online. We will be working with this group and others to make sure their transitions are smooth as well.
- Housing waiting list is at 200+. If we get questions about housing, refer them to Taylor Whitehead in University Recruiting as we have designated her as our point person with inquiries about off-campus housing.
- As of last Thursday, Frog Pond representatives let us know that they had only 25 beds left. FP has a 1-year lease policy that include more up-front costs, but equals out to about the same as CLV fees.
- As of last Wednesday, we had approximately 200 who had applied for housing but with no Freshman Connection code. The recruiting office staff have been contacting those students to see if they still plan to attend. The majority of them are, and we are getting them registered for Freshman Connection, but approximately 15 indicated they no longer plan to attend NSU and this has freed up a few beds in housing.
