MASTER OF SCIENCE Allied Health (MSAH)

The Master of Science in Allied Health at Northwestern State University provides a specialized program of study that will prepare baccalaureate allied health professionals to become leaders in allied health. The MSAH program offers two concentrations in the areas of allied health clinical education and clinical operations. The program allows allied health professionals to earn a graduate degree in their discipline and to develop skills that will assist with career advancement within allied health clinical education and allied health clinical operations.

Program Design

The program is designed to allow allied health professionals to continue to work while they pursue their degree. The classes for the MSAH program are 100% online. Out-of-state fees are waived for students taking only online courses.

Program Requirements

Students enrolling in the Master of Science in Allied Health program must meet the eligibility requirements for Graduate Studies at Northwestern State University. In addition, entry into the program requires a bachelor's degree, and students must hold credentials in one of the allied health professions. Also, students must have completed an undergraduate statistics or research course.
