ULS Day at the Capitol

On Monday, I joined fellow presidents, faculty, staff, and students from all nine universities for ULS Day at the Capitol. This annual event in Baton Rouge showcases the talent, innovation, and statewide impact of our University of Louisiana System institutions. Special thanks to Leah Jackson for coordinating our participation and to Professors Corbin Covher and Dr. Meryn Olivier, who represented the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Nursing and School of Allied Health, respectively. Professor Covher's demonstration using Meta Quest headsets and Adobe's Substance software generated significant interest. His students are creating 3D sculptures with remarkable efficiency, producing work that can be printed on 3D printers or used in digital environments such as video games. I was especially proud to learn that this methodology is not being offered anywhere else in the system, further demonstrating how NSU continues to lead through innovation and distinction.
