- To remain in the NSU MSW Program, a student must make a "C" or above in any required Social Work course by the second completed attempt. Withdrawal from a social work course does not count in the two completed attempts.
- A student must have no more than two courses with "C" grades on the plan of study
- Earned grades of "D" or "F" will require an academic review before a student may proceed
- *May be waived based upon academic standing in BSW program
- **Students must earn at least a "B" in all practice and field practicum courses





Courses taken outside of a student's degree program are not eligible for Title IV federal financial aid (grants and loans). However, elective courses are eligible for Title IV aid if they are required and included in the student's program of study. Once a student has completed all required elective credits, any additional elective courses taken beyond the program's requirements will not be eligible for Title IV funding.
