

M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction with a concentration in Reading (504E)

The Master of Education (M.Ed.) program in Curriculum and Instruction with a concentration in Reading is designed for elementary, middle or secondary teachers who desire to work with students with reading competencies. This program enhances instructional expertise. As of September 2024, you must earn a passing score on the Praxis: Teaching of Reading: Elementary (5205) or Teaching of Reading: Elementary Subtest (7002)

Prerequisites for this program include a valid teaching license as well as admission to the graduate school.

Degree requirements for this program and concentration include 12 hours of foundation coursework; 9 hours of support and application coursework; and 15 hours of concentration coursework.
