- Lease agreement with the Demons Unlimited Foundation for NSU Softball scoreboard replacement
- Lease agreement with the Demons Unlimited Foundation for Walter Ledet Track Complex scoreboard replacement
- Fiscal year 2025–2026 five-year capital outlay plan
