

School Librarian

(add-on)

An authorization to serve as school librarian will be added to the certificate for teaching in the elementary or secondary school for those teachers who have completed a minimum of 18 semester hours in library science (LDOE)

Coursework may be taken through NSU at the undergraduate or graduate level. At the graduate level, students may choose to pursue a M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction with a concentration in Library Science. Twelve of the 18 hours in this certification may be used toward the M.Ed. degree.
