Introduction

This Graduate Admissions Guide provides an accessible overview of admissions requirements for each graduate program at Northwestern State University. It is intended to support prospective students, applicants, and recruiters by summarizing key expectations and helping students navigate the admissions process. While this guide highlights program-specific requirements, the official source for all academic policies, curricula, degree plans, and university regulations is the University Catalog, available through the [University Registrar](#).

The University Catalog presents the current curricula, educational plans, course offerings, requirements, and policies of Northwestern State University. Catalogs take effect each fall semester and remain in effect for the following spring and summer sessions. Degree requirements are also published on each academic department's website. Students are responsible for being informed of these requirements. Any changes in academic regulations enacted between catalog publications are communicated through various university channels, and students are responsible for knowing these updates.

Admission to the Graduate School

Applicants for admission to Northwestern State University shall not be denied admission on the basis of sex, race, creed, or national origin.

Apply on-line at the Graduate School website. Application fee should accompany the application. Admission to the Graduate School does not imply admission to any specific degree program.

Students who do not attend Northwestern State University for three consecutive semesters (including summer) or longer and who then return to the University must complete the course work prescribed in the catalog in effect at the time of return. A lapse in enrollment of 12 calendar months, or more, will require reapplication and payment of an additional admission fee. Graduate students are responsible for reading and following the regulations and requirements of the Graduate School.
