The Louisiana Legislature on Friday passed a final budget in which higher education did not receive any cuts and TOPS was fully funded. This is the best news we could have expected out of the session. Although we still trail our competitors in terms of resources per student, this year's budget provides a foundation upon which to expand our investment in higher education.

The trip was highlighted by a joint recital at the oldest theatre in Cartagena and attended by over 800 people. Dr. Greg Handel, who accompanied the students on the trip, said, "The theatre, crowd, and preparation defied every expectation I had going in. Finally, I want to acknowledge and express appreciation for the continued support of our generous alumni. This week, we announced a donation from the family of the late Allen and Mary Lee Posey. This latest gift, when matched by the Board of Regents support fund, creates a \$100,000 Distinguished Graduate Scholarship in Education, <u>http://news.nsula.edu/home/posey-family-fulfills-scholarship/</u>. This gift is so important in making scholarship dollars available to students pursuing advanced degrees at NSU.
