MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN NORTHWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA AND PANOLA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Northwestern State University of Louisiana (NSU) and Panola Community College (PCC) have agreed to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding for a 2 + 2 program between the two institutions. The 2+2 program will allow students to complete the first two years of study toward the Associate Degree in Medical Laboratory Technician at PCC and then transfer all credit hours as designated in Appendix A to NSU for completion of the degree. Students transferring to NSU may complete the last two years of their course work either online or at one of the NSU campuses. Both universities serve the needs of the constituency and are responsive, student oriented institutions that prepare the students to become productive members of society as well as promote the academic development and improvement in the quality of life of citizens in their regions.

This partnership is mutually beneficial to both institutions for several reasons. Traditional and non-traditional students attending PCC will have the opportunity after completing core requirements at PCC to transfer to an accredited program that will accept PCC credits. NSU will have the opportunity to accept students into degree programs who are well prepared with foundation course work.

Both universities are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Both universities employ full-time faculty with advanced academic and professional credentials.

Both institutions provide support resources (i.e., library, on-line access, service courses, and adequate administrative-faculty-staff backup).

In accordance with this Memorandum of Understanding, Panola Community College agrees to:

Provide academic advising to students who plan to transfer to NSU according to agreements in Appendix A.

Require PCC students who intend to transfer to NSU sign the Intent to transfer form and mail the completed form to NSU. (Appendix B)

Provide students the opportunity to obtain the PCC credit hours as listed in Appendix A of the Memorandum of Understanding between NSU and PCC.

Provide transferring students assistance in completing the NSU Application for Admission.

Provide information about the 2+2 Agreement in the Panola Community College catalog.

Jointly market the 2 + 2 agreement with NSU.

In accordance with this Memorandum of Understanding, Northwestern State University agrees to:

Receive and maintain "Intent to Transfer" forms from PCC students and honor the agreement regarding academic catalog in effect on the date of the student's signature and the NSU confirmation signature. (Appendix B)

Accept Panola Community College credit hours as listed in Appendix A of the Memorandum of Understanding between Northwestern State University and Panola Community College.

Provide PCC with a list of admitted students each semester.

Provide information about the 2+2 Agreement in the Northwestern State University catalog.

Jointly market the 2+2 agreement with PCC.

By signature of President of these institutions, this 2+2 Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on the 4th of May, 2016.

This agreement may be revised only with the signatures of the leaders of both institutions.
