- Jamie Flanagan:
  - Joined meeting to report on her participation in the ULS Management and Leadership Institutes she has attended so far this academic year. Thomas Reynolds has also been attending these meetings at other schools across the state. Northwestern hosted the meeting in December, and it was a great success.
- Greg Burke:
  - External:
    - Demons Unlimited Foundation annual fund in progress Close to \$200,000 was generated in year-end donations, endowments, and sponsorships. Annual fund is now at 75% of \$400,000 goal (plus additional restricted fund raising by coaches).
    - Demons Unlimited Foundation sponsorship sales/commitments 96% of \$297,000 goal.

- Academic/Life Skills:

  - Athletic Department GPA for fall semester of 3.044 marks third consecutive semester of 3.0 cumulative GPA for all 370 student-athletes.

  - NSU released NCAA Graduation Success Rate (for six-year period of 2011-12 through 2016-17) of 75%.

  - NSU has been offered a seat on the *Troops to Education* Alternative Route to Licensure Advisory Committee. The ARL group is one of four advisory committees that will provide input and guidance as the bill moves its way through the process and into operation. This is an excellent opportunity for NSU to establish an early connection with this project and help shape its framework as it moves into the operational phase. There is also the potential for NSU to participate in the operational phase as an ARL provider and serve our military personnel, veterans, and partner school districts. **Overview**: *Troops to Education* is a new proposed federal program that will replace and expand the former *Troops to Teachers* program. The new *Troops to Education* bill, which is scheduled to be introduced in the House this month by Congressman Ryan Costello of PA, greatly expands the scope of *Troops to Teachers from veterans who left the service within the past three years to all veterans who have honorable discharges*, spouses of active duty personnel and veterans (including National Guard and Reserve), and active duty personnel who expect to leave the service within the next few years. The chief thrust of new program will be to provide scholarships for eligible participants to become teachers in participating districts via alternate routes to

licensure as well as professional support for participants through their probationary periods on the job. It will also fund training for those seeking non-instructional positions with school districts. Including federal and partner funding, the initial projected annual budget for the program is \$30 million.
