This discussion included the approach we will use to close out all actions, decisions, and/or recommendations to maximize the best possible outcomes. On Tuesday, we will distribute the AY 2017-2018 Assessment – Validating Our Approach via the faculty and student Messenger. The team also discussed the requirements for the

SACSCOC fifth-year report and confirmed the appropriate university office ownership of those requirements. Lastly, we started a dialogue on how best to transition from an exclusively internal assessment process to a more holistic evaluation of our progress toward our vision in becoming the premier regional university.

Thursday morning, I met with Drake Owens, Jerry Pierce and Dr. Mary Edith Stacy to work on logistics for the upcoming campus visit by Gov. John Bel Edwards and First Lady Donna Edwards. Mrs. Edwards will be the featured guest speaker at the NSU Middle Laboratory School Orchestra Fall Gala Dinner on Tuesday in the Friedman Student Union. The Gala is for the benefit of the Orchestra's 2019 Carnegie Hall Performance in New York.

Thursday afternoon, Dr. Marcus Jones, Jennifer Kelly and I joined the leadership team from Campus Living Villages for a Varnado Hall financial briefing. Afterwards, I visited with faculty and students at the Hospitality, Management and Tourism student social at the Culinary Arts Kitchen and later attended a Natchitoches Community Alliance Board of Directors meeting at City Hall.

That evening, Jennifer and I hosted the Lady Demon Soccer team for a pre-conference opener meal at the President's Residence.
