# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

### BETWEEN

# NORTHWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA

### AND

### CENTENARY COLLEGE

Northwestern State University of Louisiana (NSU) and Centenary College have agreed to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions. Both institutions are responsive, student/employee-oriented institutions. NSU seeks to assist Centenary students with preferred admission into our BS to BSN Accelerated Curriculum (BAC). This agreement will accommodate students seeking the BSN degree upon completion of a BS degree in Biology, Chemistry, or related hard science from Centenary College.

NSU and Centenary have a mutual desire to prepare students for success in the field of Nursing and related healthcare fields.

This agreement is mutually beneficial for several reasons. NSU College of Nursing and School of Allied Health (CONSAH) and Centenary College are located within 3 miles of one another in Shreveport, LA. Centenary students will have access to CONSAH without having to relocate, and NSU students have access to the regional clinical resources available throughout Shreveport. Each institution shares an interest in providing educational opportunities to the citizens of northwest Louisiana, and meeting the needs of the growing healthcare industry in Shreveport.

In accordance with this Agreement, NSU and Centenary will work collaboratively to achieve the following:

# **GOALS**

Provide academic advising to Centenary students about the BS to BSN (BAC) curriculum.

To assist Centenary students in the advising process and to ease the transition between institutions.

To provide a program of study for degree completion in four (4) semesters/15 months: Summer, Fall, Spring, Summer. (Refer to Curriculum Chart for Degree Completion Outline)

To develop collegiality and communication among the institutions' discipline faculty and administrators.

To achieve these goals, Centenary and NSU hereby enter into the following agreement.

# **PROVISIONS**

Students will be expected to meet all Admission requirements. Those include:

- Completion of a baccalaureate or higher degree in biology, chemistry or related science field.
- Overall GPA 3.0 or higher on 4.0 scale.
- Completion of all prerequisite courses required for the BSN degree.
- Submission of all documents required by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing by the stated deadline.
- Completion of all required entrance examinations with satisfactory scores.

Additionally, students are expected to adhere to Progression, Dismissal, and Graduation requirements upon acceptance into the BS to BSN program.

### **TERMS**

This agreement shall be effective on September 5, 2019, and continue until terminated by either party giving one year written notice to the other party in order to protect students enrolled.

### NOTICE

Any changes to this MOU must be done in writing and delivered by certified mail or by personal delivery to the person to be notified.
