Last academic year, there were 13 graduates of Northwestern State University's Counseling Program. Of these, 7 graduated from the School Counseling Concentration and there were 6 graduates of the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Concentration. Graduates in the Clinical Mental Health Concentration are required to pass the NCE in order to obtain licensure. However, not all graduates take the NCE before graduation.

Graduates in the School Counseling concentration are required to pass the NCE in order to obtain licensure and the PRAXIS to obtain their School Counseling Certification.

Of the admitted students, 100% graduated from the program in the expected time period and 100% of those program graduates who are actively seeking jobs are employed.
