Frances Conine:

- Student Council camps starts this week. Mr. Phil Gugliuzza will be honored for 40 years of service to the LA Association of Student Councils. The camp has been hosted on Northwestern's campus each year since 1979.
- Northwestern will be hosting Boy and Girls State camp next.
- The University has hosted two very successful Freshman Connection sessions on the main campus; sessions will also be conducted on the Shreveport, Leesville, and Alexandria campuses. Two FC sessions in Natchitoches are remaining.
- Received the Ruffalo-Noel Levitz (RNL) student satisfaction survey results; they are significantly above the national average. Report will be shared with the team.
- Received the report on the RNL review of retention and recruiting. The consultant was very pleased with the results. Will be shared with the team.
- Working on reports including strategic planning.

Roni Biscoe:

- The Legislative Auditors are on campus and held their Entrance Interview with Dr. Maggio, Dr. Jones, Dawn Eubanks, Cathy Trichel and I on Thursday, May 30th. - We are continuing our budget preparations for the 2019-20 FY. The Legislative Session ends June 6th, so we should know our final state funding soon afterwards.

Frank Hall:

- I have received several assessment reports over the last couple of weeks to review. I will provide feedback to the authors today or tomorrow. I sent an email on 8 May outlining the specifics.
- The Strategic Planning Team and the University Assessment Committee will meet next week, on 12 and 13 June respectively. Email/calendar invitations with agenda and associated attachments will be distributed this week. Both meetings will take place in the Henderson Conference Room at 3:00 on their respective dates.
- The SACSCOC planning committee has approved my proposal to present at the Annual SACSCOC Conference 7-10 December 2019.

- Session Description: Northwestern State University (NSU) of Louisiana, less than a year from its SACSCOC Decennial Review, successfully redesigned its approach to assessment by establishing a holistic institutional effectiveness model that provides structure, ensures participation, standardization, predictability, flexibility, and accountability. Each attendee will receive a handout with a series of reflection discussion questions to be used to facilitate interactive discussion allowing attendees to capture options and key points to review once they return to their university. The presenter will highlight components of the IE model describing the lessons learned while providing attendees examples and tools used throughout the process, how NSU made the Strategic Plan meaningful, how it standardized its assessment process across all academic programs, administrative-academic support units, including the University's General Education Core. Lastly, how resources can be tied to a transparent bottom-up requirement review process. At the conclusion, attendees will gain an appreciation of how to design a holistic approach to assessment, have tangible assessment tools options, and an email list of assessment points of contacts they can leverage long after the conference ends.

- Thank you, Dr. Maggio, for the "shout out" on Social Media regarding the School of Education's CAEP accreditation, accolades by the National Council of Teacher Quality (NCTQ) regarding the Elementary education program, and the unveiling of a new recruiting program, Call Me Mister. What a banner week for the School of Education! We appreciate your support very much.
- A new Department Head has been named for the Social Work Department, Dr. Ruth Weinzettle. She is completing an interim year and will move into this permanent position on July 1, 2019.
- The GCEHD Leadership team will meet on June 24 to plan for 2019-2020. One new initiative for 2019-2020 will be the Gallaspy Lecture series as professional development for GCEHD faculty. Looking forward to sharing more about this initiative.

- The Central Louisiana Instructional Partnership (CLIP) kicked off on May 20-21 with training for mentors and residents from 8 rural parishes. NSU benefits from this grant through a new position within the SOE along with full tuition for each participant (44 students over the next 4 years).
- There will be changes in the tuition structure for the 2019-2020 lab school. Additionally, we will begin advertising for a new Director of the Child Development Center shortly.
- The Title IVE grant, facilitated by the Social Work Department is expanding. They have added another full-time position to the department for fall 2019.

Drake Owens:

- The Golden Jubilee 50-Year Graduation Reunion was held in concert with commencement exercises on May 10th. Fifty-four graduates received their second diploma.
- The 50+ Graduate Luncheon was held on May 11th with over 200 former 50-year graduates in attendance.
- Wayne and Sandra McCullen contributed \$50,000 to the NSU Foundation to establish the McCullen Family Endowed Scholarship in Nursing.
- The NSU Foundation is exploring the possibility of additional property acquisition on University Parkway.
- Legislative session will end on June 6th. Outlook is positive senate passed best higher education budget in a decade. Capital projects including Kyser Hall and demolition funds are included in HB2 as originally submitted.
- NSU Foundation/Alumni Association board meetings will be held on the Shreveport campus June 28th.
- Annual Washington D.C. ALAE Crawfish Boil will be held June 8th.
- Johnny Antoon Memorial Golf Tournament will be held June 15th.
- Plans underway for major fall events including Faculty/Staff Luncheon, NSU-LSU tailgate event, Homecoming festivities, and Gala @ The Strand.

- External:
 - Annual Fund currently at \$335,005.
 - The 2019-20 Demons Unlimited Foundation annual giving brochure has been printed and is being mailed.
 - N-Club currently at \$13,680 (281 paying members and 116 Free Graduating Senior memberships).
 - Athletic Director is including N-Club membership in beginning of semester team talks.
 - Continuing to send monthly N-Club newsletters featuring N-Club member of the month, upcoming events, and new memberships.

 - A track reunion was held in conjunction with Southland Conference championship meet at NSU and 25-year baseball reunion in recognition of 1994

conference champion/NCAA postseason team was held the weekend of May 3-5. Also, a softball alumni reunion was held the weekend of April 5-6.

- Vic's Kids Club membership revenue is at \$3,435 (goal was \$2,500).
- Overall ticket revenue (season and gate sales) now total #362,140 which will be the second highest ticket sales total ever.
- Beginning on May 1, Demons Unlimited Foundation donors at the \$250 and higher level had first priority to order up to six tickets for the NSU-LSU game in Baton Rouge on September 14. Season tickets holders will next have access to these tickets, followed by the general public.
- Erika Moulder, a graduate of the Baylor University Sports Management program who has been working with the Seattle WNBA team in marketing and ticket sales, will be NSU's new Peak Sports Management representative.
- The rescheduled NSU-LSU baseball game at Brown-Stroud Field on March 12 generated nearly \$50,000 in ticket sales, corporate hospitality areas, concessions and other revenue streams. NSU gained priceless publicity as the game was aired live on ESPN Plus and represented the first non-football and basketball event that ESPN has chosen to telecast. The Demons won 3-1!
- The NSU-LSU softball game on March 5 resulted in selling all chair back and general admission seats and generated \$3,056.
- Approximately \$200,000 in "quiet phase" commitments have been secured for the "Victorious" facility campaign with additional funding requests on the horizon.
- Dates have been finalized and planning continues for the nine-stop "Victory Tour" in late July to promote the upcoming football season. Stops will be held in Many, Alexandria, Shreveport/Bossier, Lake Charles, Lafayette, Baton Rouge, New Orleans, Houston, and Dallas.
- The N-Club Hall of Fame list of eligible candidates has been developed and forwarded to N-Club members for nominations. The selection committee will meet on June 5.
- Plans are being developed for a "Screamin' Demons" student support group on June.
- A record 128 responses were to a postseason football season ticket holder survey and a similar survey was sent to basketball season ticket holders.
- Academic/Life Skills:
 - The traditional graduation reception was held on May 9 with nearly 30 student-athletes in attendance.
 - NSU student-athletes compiled 4,580 community services hours for the 2018-2019 year and finished fourth in the Southland Conference "Southland Strong" rankings.
