Roni Biscoe:

- IR reported census numbers for the spring semester on January 31, 2020.
- IR will participate in an ULS group project to benefit all universities in the system a dashboard for SACSCOC standard 8.1.
- Reminder to participate in the mandatory training for calendar year 2020 Preventing Sexual Harassment (PSH), PSH for Supervisors, and Ethics. Tracy Brown is assisting with a way for students to participate without the use of Moodle or another platform; it involves a web-based design.
- There is continued talk regarding Dual Enrollment, as institutions try to address SACSCOC concerns.

Tracy Brown:

- The procurement of items for the STAT grants is almost complete. Larger projects are working through standard procurement methods and procedures. Some hardware and software items are starting to arrive, and installation dates scheduled.
- The data center storage and backup appliances have been received and installed. We will be working the next couple of weeks to verify the installation and begin the process of transitioning workload to the new hardware.
- On Wednesday, January 29, I attended the first meeting of the CENLA Cybersecurity Working Group. The purpose of this organization is to bring together industry, government, and education institutions together to help combat and educate against cybersecurity issues that threaten central Louisiana.
- Planning for the annual LONI Summit is underway. The LONI Summit is a yearly gathering of all LONI institutions to receive updates, plan initiatives, and share ideas. I serve as a member of the Summit planning committee. Northwestern hosted the event last year at the Alexandria campus at England Airpark. This year the event will be hosted by UL Lafayette on March 18th and 19th. The Summit will attract between 70-80 individuals. Northwestern will have five individuals in attendance with two staff members delivering presentations.
- Work continues to develop a plan and strategy of migrating the University away from our current Nortel PBX telephone system to a modern Voice of IP (VoIP) telephone system. The current Nortel phone system was first installed in 2000 and was last upgraded in 2008. Avaya purchased Nortel in 2009 and officially ended all support of the Nortel hardware and software in June 2018. Our current support contract expires on June 2020, with no options to extend or purchase more support services.
