1. Describe target audience.

Northwestern State University communication majors and minors as well as any noncommunication students taking classes in the Lang/Comm Department are the target audience. The citizens of the city of Natchitoches and the students of Northwestern State University who view NSU TV and NSU YouTube page. The people that will view graduation and any other programs that we web-stream for NSU on the internet.

2. Describe project/initiative for which you are requesting funds.

The students in the mass communication classes will use the new equipment in the production of classroom assignments and projects. The new Avid Non-Linear Editing System will allow our students the chance to get out of the studio and work on projects around the campus. It will also replace systems that were purchased in 2000. The current system is used to edit videos for NSU TV; nsula.edu; NSU FTP site for TV stations; NSU YouTube Channel and nsudemons.com. The new cameras will replace camera that were purchased in 2000. The new Studio equipment will bring our studio up to date with equipment used in TV station across the country to give our students a leg up on other college students! Our studio equipment is outdated and this will allow us to stream from the studio.

- 3. State measurable objectives that will be used to determine the impact/effectiveness of the project.
- A. Student projects and assignments will be used to determine the impact/effectiveness of the equipment.
- B. All students taking appropriate mass communication classes will complete semester reviews of classes and teachers.
- 4. Indicate how each project objective will be evaluated.
- A. Student projects and assignments will be used to determine the impact/effectiveness of the equipment.
- B. NSU TV staff and mass communication staff will watch and listen to reviews of the programs and the quality of the projects that will be edited with the new editing equipment and recorded in the studio.
- 5. If funded, which NSTEP http://www.nsula.edu/nstep/NSTEP.pdf objective(s) will this funding of this project advance? How will funding of the project advance the University and College/unit technology plan?

The objective that will be advance if this project was funded include:

- 1. To improve access to technology by students, faculty, and staff at Northwestern State University. (New Avid Editing Systems, the equipment we currently use was purchased in 2000 and technology has made many advancements since it was purchased. The new studio equipment will replace outdate equipment and the new cameras will replace cameras purchased 13 years ago.)
- 2. To provide classrooms with updated technology and multimedia. (We would use the editing systems, studio equipment and cameras in classes to show students how to edit projects and give students hands-on experience with new technology.)
- 5. To upgrade and maintain the campus communication network and infrastructure. (Editing systems, studio equipment and cameras will be used with producing products to be used with video production and web-streaming of different events on NSU campus.)
- 7. To establish processes that encourage technology initiatives by faculty, staff, and students. (New editing system equipment, studio equipment and cameras would give both students and faculty/staff the ability to do more hands on work and learn more about the new technology.)
- 9. To maintenance support of hardware and software upgrades, new hardware and software for specialized functions, training for technical support personnel. (We haven't upgraded since 2000

and the technology has change over the years.)

With the funding of this project the university would be upgrading not only equipment for students' use but also the upgrade for the quality of production of NSU TV and university programming. NSU TV can broadcast over Sudden Link Cable and now CP-Tel Cable 24 hours a day and can provide students and the citizens of Natchitoches any information that the university needs to broadcast. With the flip of a switch the president, the university chief of police or any other emergency official can broadcast over the air. The upgrade will enable NSU TV and the university to transmit a broadcast quality product that will be seen and heard without any dropouts or distortion.

6. Provide a justification for funding of this project. Estimate the number of student that will be served per academic year and in what ways. Please indicate also any unique needs of the target group.

If our students are to remain competitive for jobs in the mass communication field, they need to learn not only the equipment we have in the studio but additional equipment and skills needed for editing. Different companies use different equipment and if our mass communication graduates can go into a job interview knowing different systems; that will give them an advantage over students from other universities that only teach one. With the editing system, it will give our students a chance to do real hands on work with state of the art technology.

- A. We offer 4 to 5 class a semester with over 80 students in those classes that would get to use the new equipment.
- B. NSU TV is broadcast over Sudden Link Cable Company in Natchitoches and CP-Tel Cable and reaches about 10,000 households as well as every campus dorm room. NSU TV is watched by NSU students and the citizens of the city of Natchitoches. During Hurricane Gusta, Ike and Isaac, NSU TV aired around-the-clock weather information about the hurricanes and its locations until the electricity failed and we were forced off the air. This was the only local weather information provided. NSU TV provided the citizens of this community and the students of NSU the information they need to help them plan for the hurricanes. A local bank president told one of our staff members that he watched NSU TV during the hurricane because it was the only local coverage and he could go to the channel at any time during the day and get a live update on what was going on with the hurricanes.
- C. Northwestern State is doing more and more digital work for our websites and for news stations around the area and country. With this new equipment we will be able to get information out faster than before and get out a better product to represent Northwestern State.
- 7. List those individuals who will be responsible for the implementation of the project/initiative and indicate their demonstrated abilities to accomplish the objectives of the project.

David Antilley II, Manager/Executive Director of NSU TV will be responsible for the equipment. David has been at NSU since 1992 and has worked with TV equipment for more than 34 years.

8. Describe any personnel (technical or otherwise) required to support the project/initiative.

Student workers and practicum students will help the staff mentioned above with the day-to-day

operation of the editing equipment.
9. Provide a schedule for implementation and evaluation.
 A. The equipment will be set up as soon as it is received by NSU TV. The equipment will go into use as soon as it is set up and checked out to make sure everything is running correctly. B. Evaluations will take place as soon as students start using the equipment. Evaluations will be conducted weekly by the teachers in charge of the classes using the equipment and by NSU TV staff. Current projects that the students will be working on include NSU News, NSU FTP tapings for TV stations, DemonLife Talk show and SGA recordings to name a few.
10. Estimate the expected life of hardware and software. Explain any anticipated equipment/software upgrades during the next five years.
The estimated lifespan of the equipment is about 6 to 8 years on the editing equipment, depending on wear and tear. Our current equipment was originally purchased in 2000 and lasted over 12 years.
11. Explain in detail a plan and policy that will be in place to ensure property security/controls for any equipment received through a Student Technology Fee. The studio equipment will be located and stored in Kyser Hall room 142. This room is locked around the clock and only staff members of NSU TV have keys to the room. The cameras will be located and stored in Kyser Hall room 104D. This room is locked around the clock and only staff members of NSU TV have keys to the room.
The cameras will be checked out and the students will sign a form to check the equipment out. Students will be able to check the camera for 3 days. Any equipment not returned, students name will be turned over to campus police.
