## History of NSU

Northwestern State University of Louisiana stands on ground that has been dedicated to learning for well over a hundred years. Prior to the Civil War a portion of the present campus was the property of the Bullard family of Natchitoches. As early as 1856 the Bullard mansion was in use as a convent by the Religious of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The following year a school building was erected at the convent, and in 1884 the property was purchased by the town and parish of Natchitoches. Three of the four great white columns that once supported the east gable of the Bullard mansion still stand on “The Hill” and often serve as the unofficial symbol of the University.

The State Legislature by Act 51 of 1884 created a Louisiana State Normal School for the preparation of teachers. A member of the Legislature, Leopold Caspari, offered the convent site as a campus for the School with the anticipated approval of the citizens of Natchitoches. The offer was accepted, and from 1885 to 1918 the Normal School offered two years of study for the training of teachers. Baccalaureate programs were then inaugurated, and the State Constitution adopted in 1921 changed the name of the school to Louisiana State Normal College.

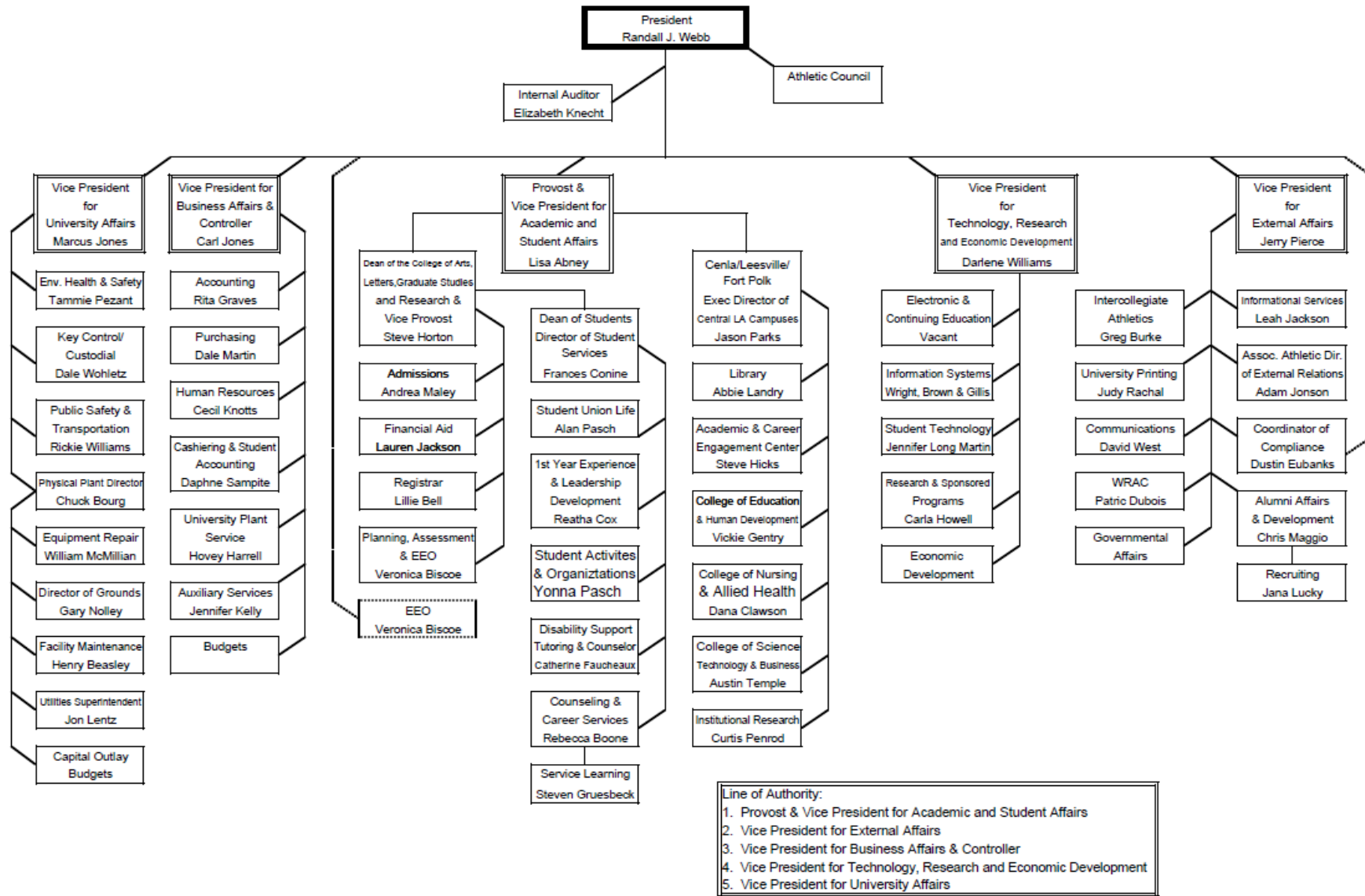
The resources and curricula of “Normal” grew steadily to meet the increasingly diverse requirements of Louisiana’s expanding population. In 1944 the institution’s excellent service in its broader role was accorded formal recognition in Act 326 of the Legislature, which changed its name to Northwestern State College of Louisiana.

Northwestern maintained and strengthened its long tradition of leadership in public service and academic endeavor and became, in 1954, the first college under the jurisdiction of the Louisiana State Board of Education to offer the Master’s degree. The Educational Specialist degree was first offered in 1966.

On June 18, 1970, Governor John J. McKeithen signed the legislative act which brought the old school its greatest distinction by changing its title to Northwestern State University of Louisiana.

In 1980 the old campus quadrangle where the columns stand was entered into the National Register of Historic Places under the title “Normal Hill Historic District.”

In 1984 Northwestern State University celebrated its Centennial with lectures, concerts, social events, and an effective fund raising effort that established the Centennial Development Fund. In addition to the main campus in Natchitoches, the University maintains full-service campus centers in Shreveport, Leesville, and Alexandria and offers instruction at eight continuing education sites in the central and northwest areas of the state.

## Accreditation

### **Institutional Accreditation**

Northwestern State University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award Associate, Baccalaureate, Master's, and Specialist's degrees. It is a member in good standing of the Association of American Colleges and also of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education.

### **Professional Accreditation**

*Biological and Physical Sciences* – The baccalaureate degrees in Biology and Physical Sciences do not have accrediting agencies. The associate degree in Veterinary Technology is accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association.

*Business* – All baccalaureate degree programs in the School of Business are accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International. The associate degree is not accredited.

*Creative and Performing Arts* – Both the baccalaureate and master's degree in Art are accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design. The baccalaureate and master's degree in Music are accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music. The baccalaureate degree in Theatre is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Theatre.

*Criminal Justice, History, and Social Sciences* - None of the baccalaureate degrees offered in the Department of Criminal Justice, History, and Social Sciences have an accreditation agency. The accreditation agency for the MS in Homeland Security is awaiting approval from the government before it begins to accredit programs.

*Educational Leadership and Technology* – The Educational Specialist in Educational Leadership and Technology, the Master's in Educational Technology Leadership, and the Master's in Educational Leadership are accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. The Master of Arts in Counseling is currently under review by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs. The Master of Arts in Student Affairs in Higher Education and the Master of Arts in Adult Education do not have an accreditation agency.

*Family and Consumer Sciences* – Both the baccalaureate degree in Family and Consumer Sciences and the baccalaureate degree in Hospitality Management and Tourism are accredited by the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences.

*Health and Human Performance* – The baccalaureate degree in Health and Physical Education is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. The baccalaureate degree in Health and Exercise Science has not sought accreditation. The master's degree in Health and Human Performance does not have an accrediting agency.

*Language and Communication* – None of the degrees offered in the Department of Language and Communication have an accreditation agency.

*Mathematics and Engineering Technology* – There is no accreditation agency for the baccalaureate degree in Mathematics. The Electronics and Industrial Engineering Technology baccalaureate degree programs are accredited by the Technology Accreditation Commission of the ABET.

*Nursing* – Both the baccalaureate and master's degree in Nursing are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. The associate degree in Nursing is accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission.

*Psychology* – There is no accreditation agency for the baccalaureate degree in Psychology or the baccalaureate degree in Addiction Studies. The master's degree in Clinical Psychology has not sought accreditation.

*Radiologic Sciences* - The baccalaureate degree in Radiologic Sciences is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology. No accreditation agency exists for the Master's in Radiologic Sciences or the baccalaureate degree in Allied Health.

*Scholars* – There is no accreditation agency for the baccalaureate degree in Liberal Arts.

*Social Work* – The baccalaureate degree in Social Work is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education.

*Teaching and Learning* - All degrees in Teaching and Learning are accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.

*University Studies* – There are no accrediting agencies for either the associate or baccalaureate degrees in General Studies.

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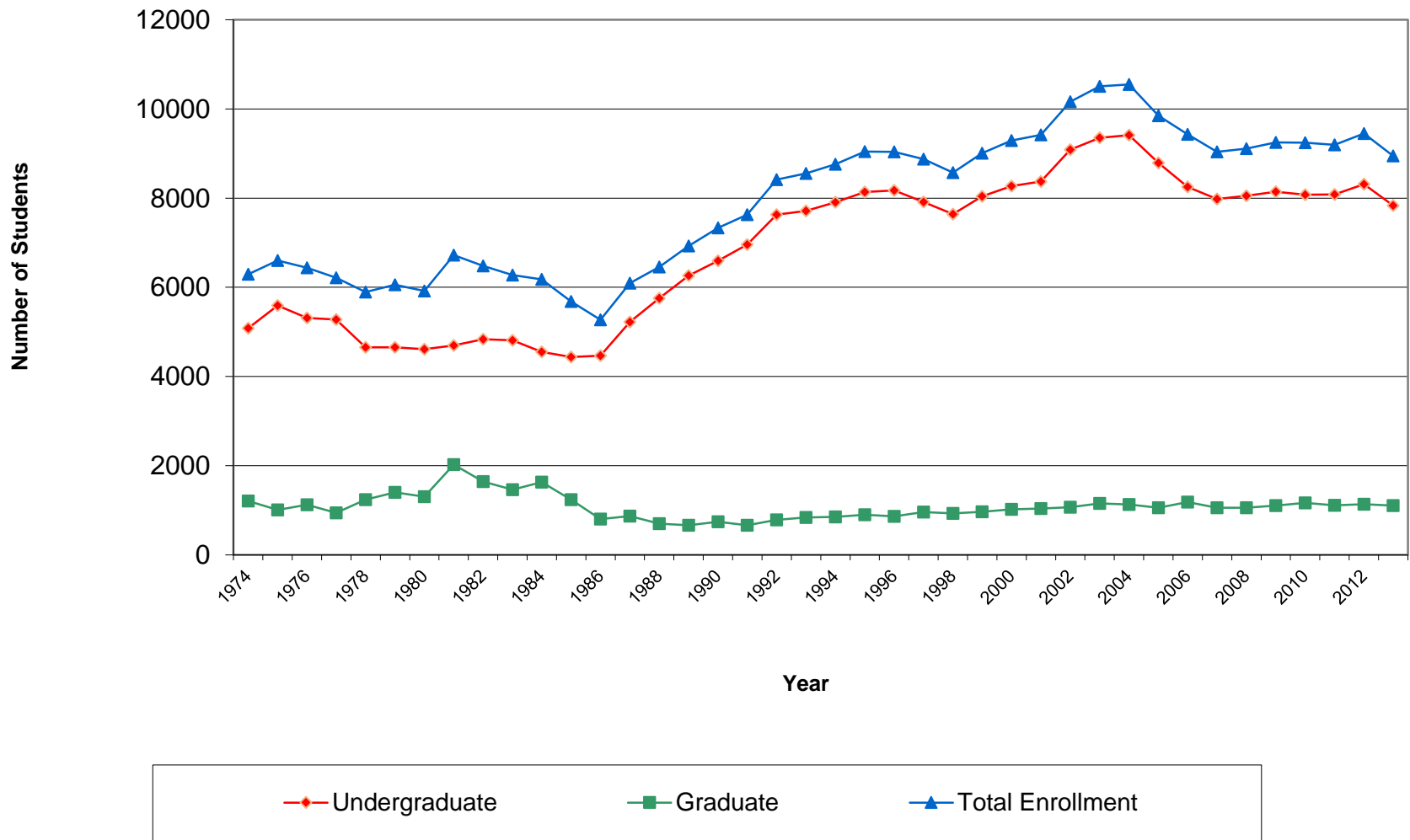

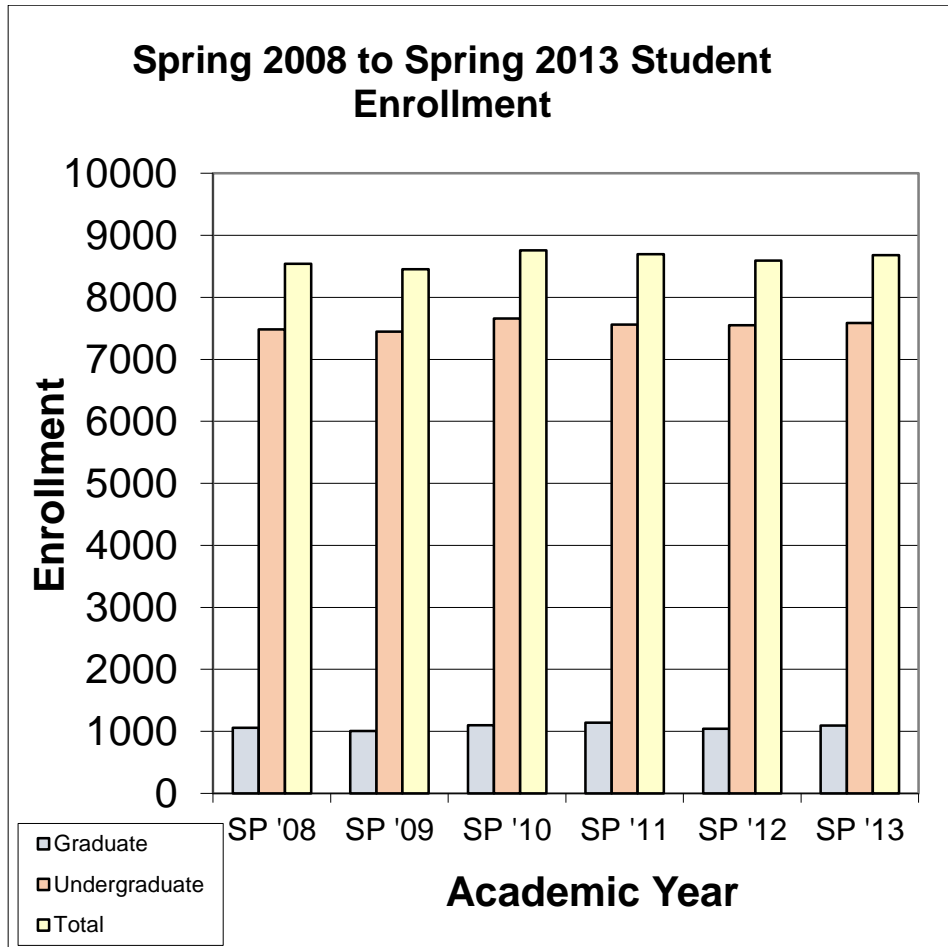
## Graduate And Undergraduate Enrollment From Fall 1974 To Fall 2013





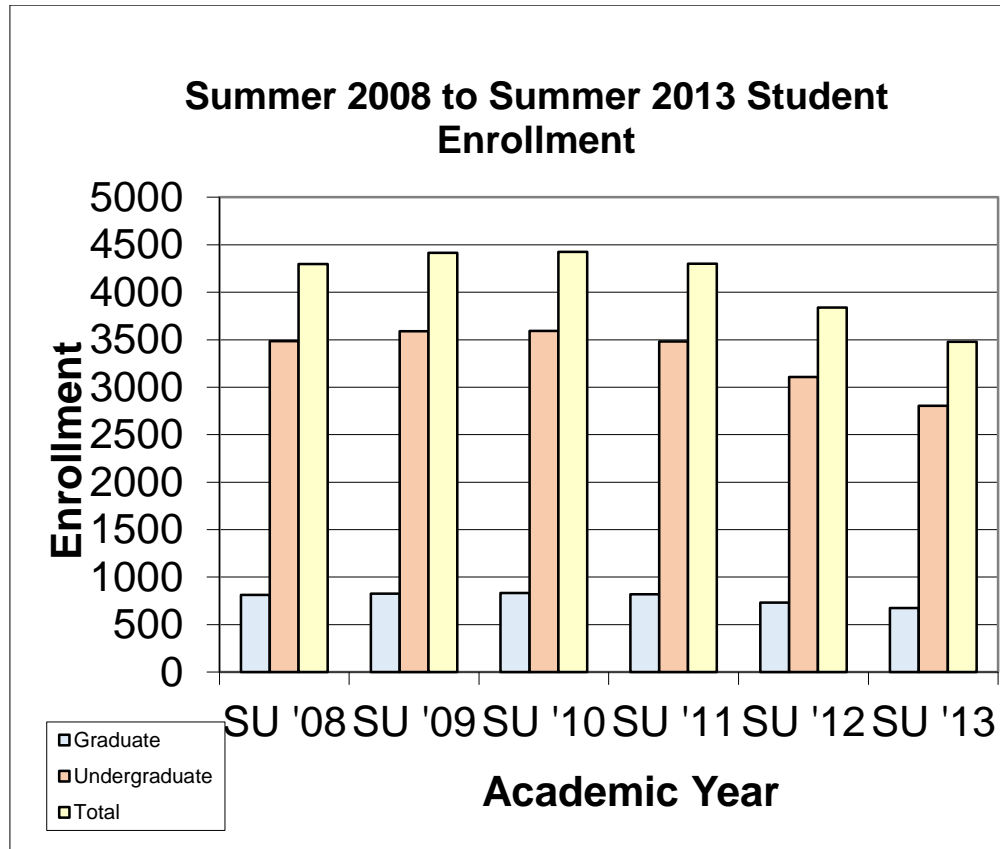

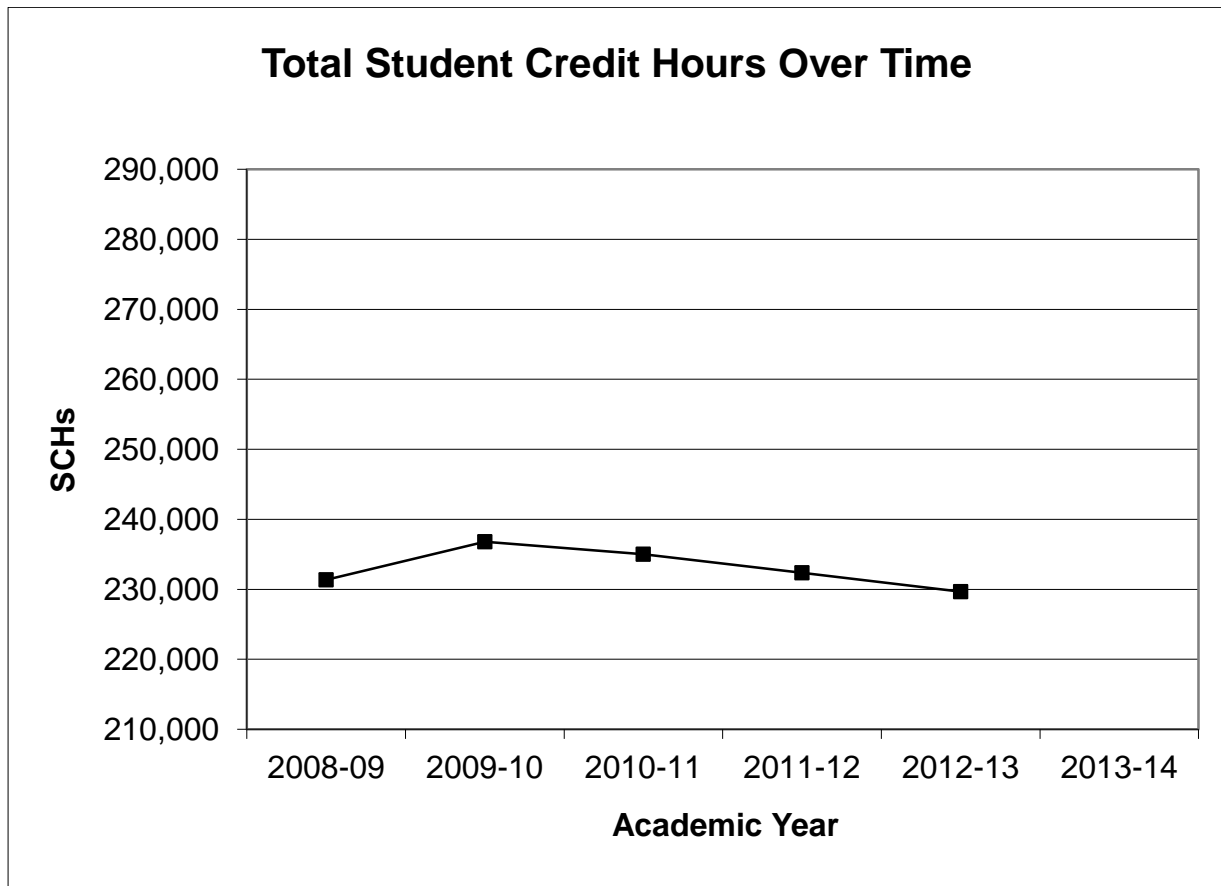

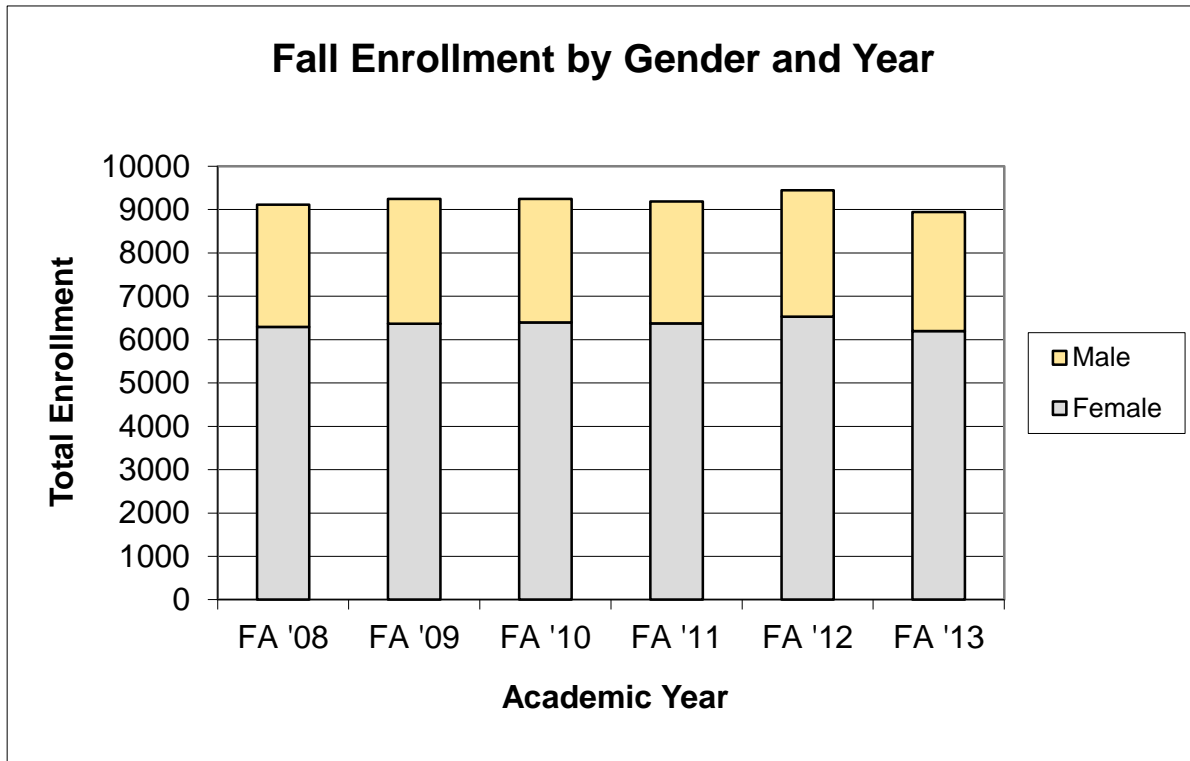

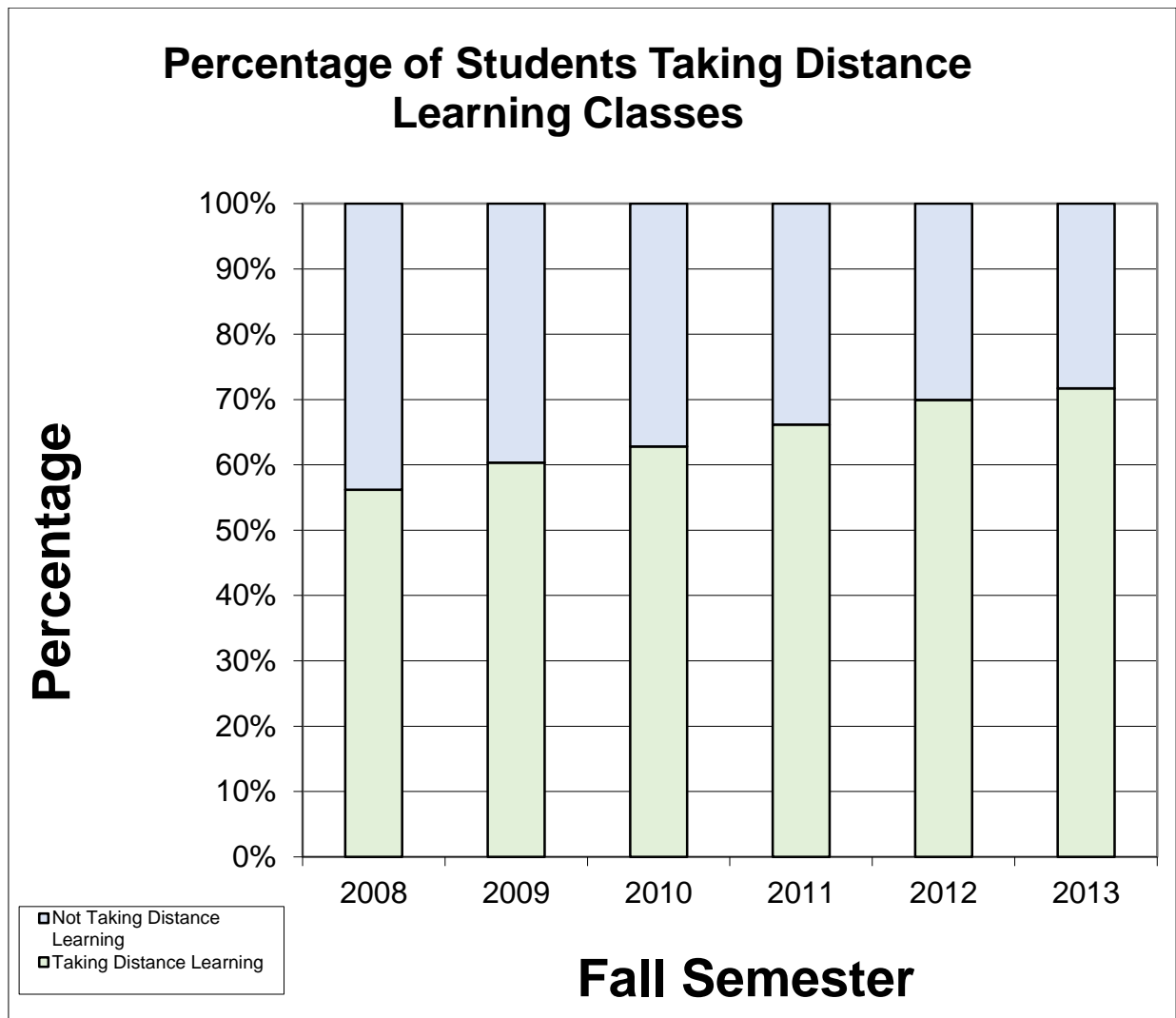

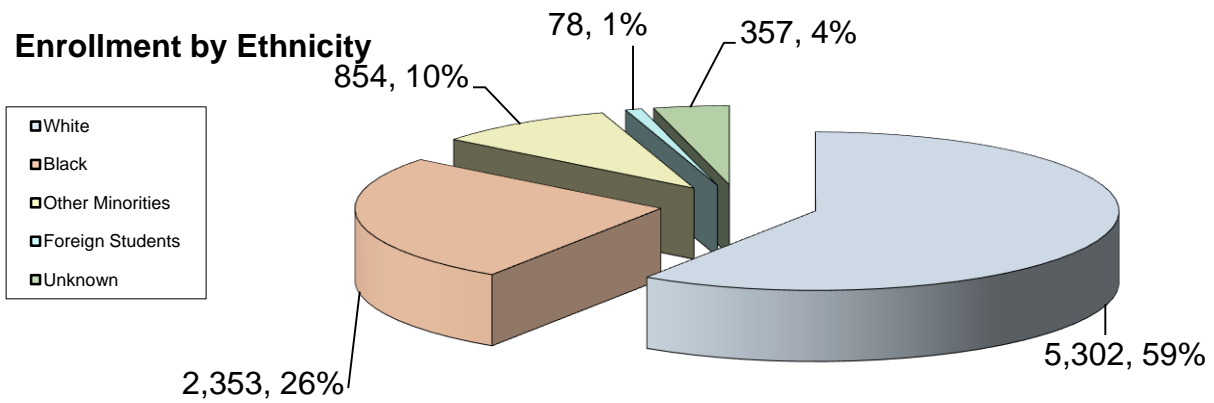

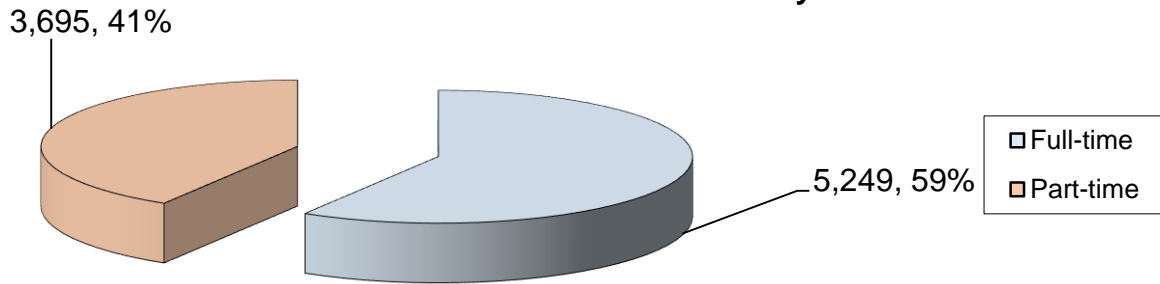
## Enrollment by Gender



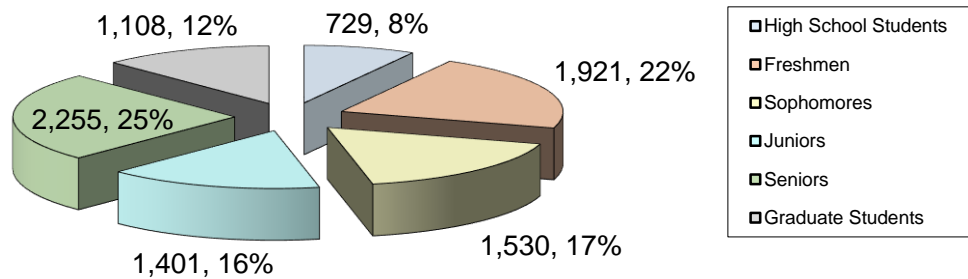
## Enrollment by Ethnicity

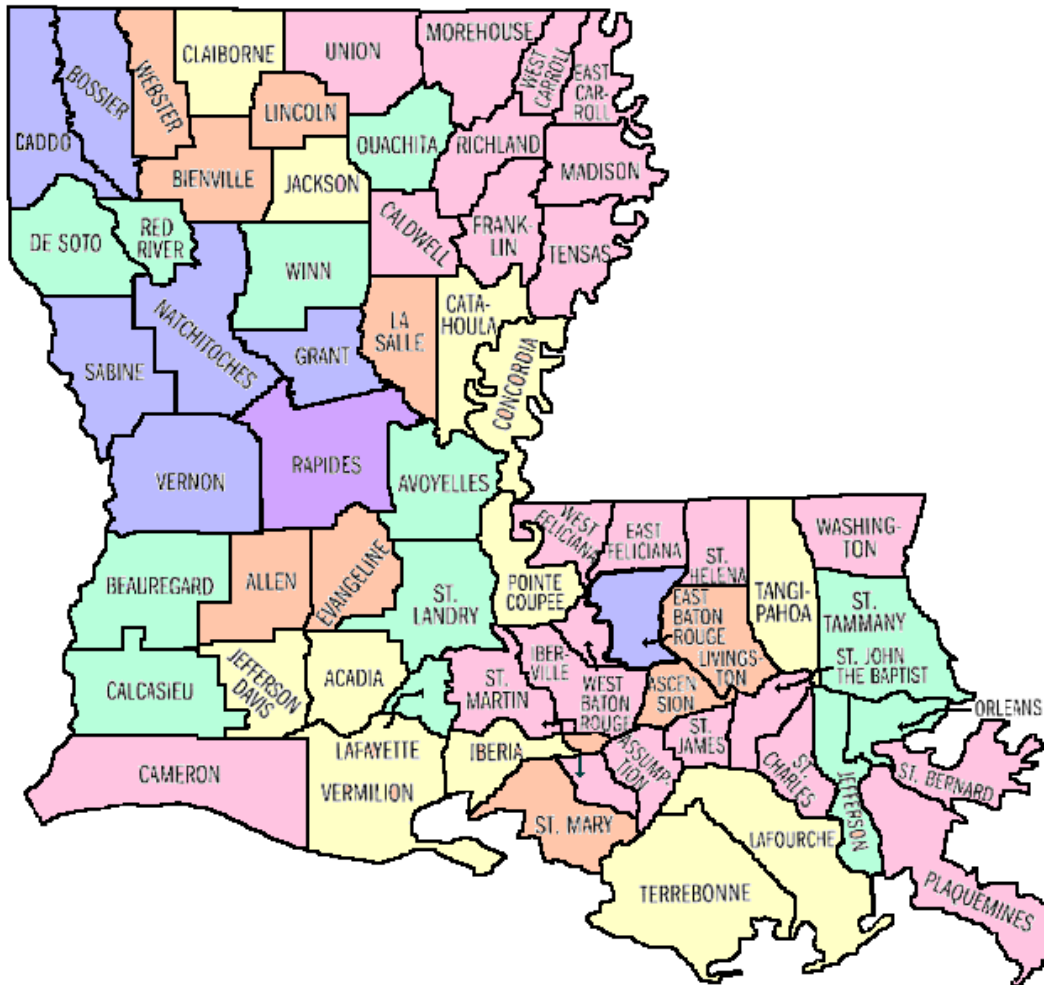

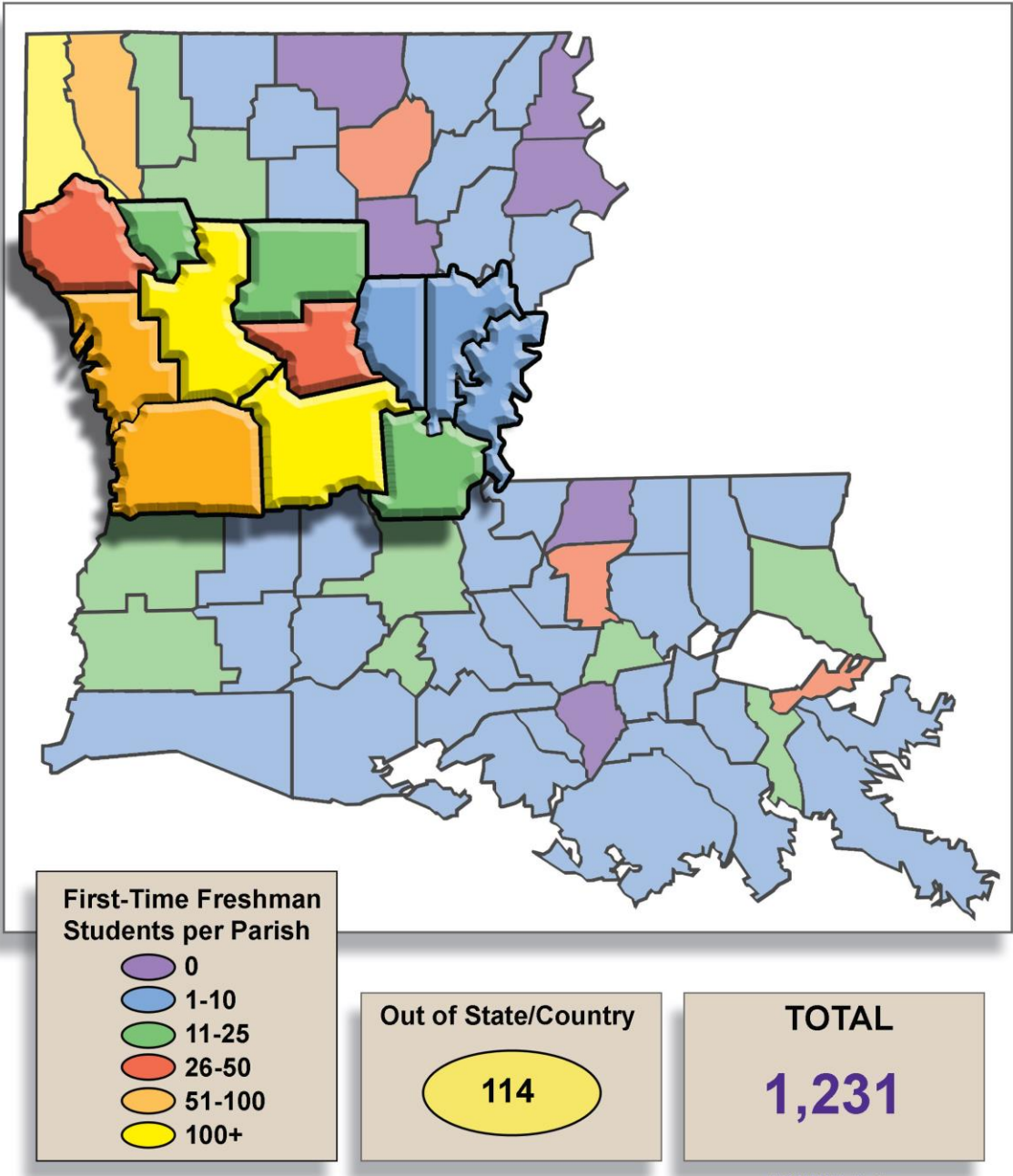
## Map of Louisiana—Number of Students Enrolled by Parish

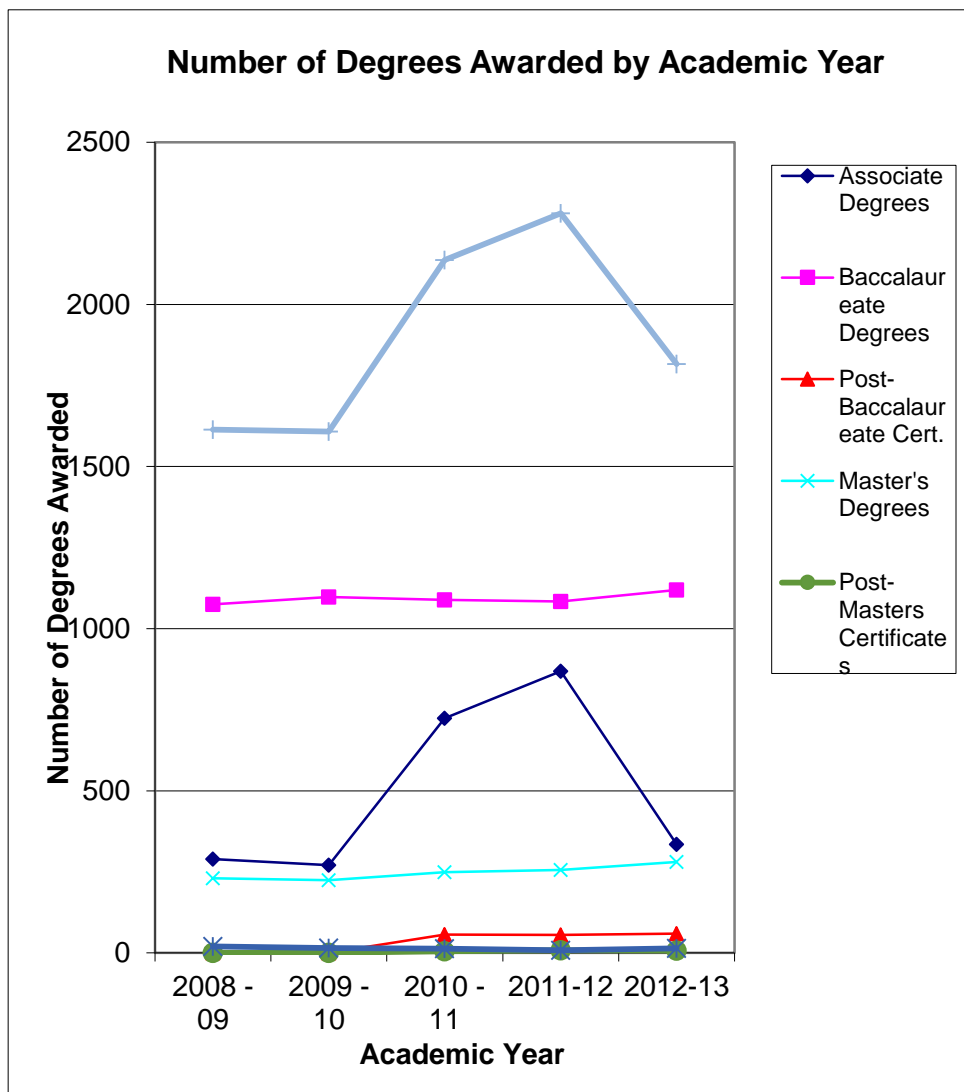

### **On-Campus Housing Policy**

According to the rules of the Board of Supervisors of the University of Louisiana System, an unmarried full-time undergraduate student is required to live on campus if space is available, unless exempt by the University for good and reasonable cause.

The University Administration has a responsibility to adhere to the policies of its governing body. Therefore, the University requires an unmarried full-time undergraduate student desiring to reside off campus to receive prior approval and to:

- 1) Live with a verifiable family member (substantiated by statement from parent or guardian).
- 2) Be classified as military veteran (documented by Form DD214).
- 3) Reside in a property owned by student or student's family (substantiated by statement from parent or guardian).
- 4) Have a significant medical problem (documented by physician's statement, which specifically states the condition, which precludes a student from residing in a residence hall).
- 5) Have a significant financial hardship (documented by notarized statement from parents indicating their contribution to cost of student's university expenses, itemized statement from student indicating funds available for expenses and anticipated expenses, copy of student's university expenses and a copy of student's W-2 form for preceding year).
- 6) Be 21 years of age or older
- 7) Have resided on campus for six semesters.
- 8) Be married, divorced (as documented by marriage license or divorce decree) or in guardianship of a dependent child (as documented by a legal documentation).
- 9) Be classified as a senior (90 or more earned semester hours).
- 10) Suffer other significant hardships if required to reside on campus (as documented by a parent or guardian, counselor, academic dean or advisor).

NSU's Office of Research and Sponsored Programs is dedicated to providing state-of-the-art information, advice, and assistance to faculty and staff relative to all sponsored-programs matters/issues and continuously seeks ways to improve the processes and services it provides. The University encourages its faculty to undertake sponsored research and other types of sponsored, scholarly activities as a means of (a) offering modern instructional programs to students and (b) enhancing the academic stature of the faculty and the University.

## Military Science Information

With an agreement signed between Northwestern State College and the Department of the United States Army, an anti-aircraft field artillery unit of the Reserve Officers Training Corps was established in the fall of 1950. In August 1950, the building to house the ROTC unit was authorized.

The new military science program, under President Prather, enrolled its first students in the fall of 1950 with one officer and five enlisted men on the staff. By the end of the 1950-51 academic year 220 men had selected military training and the future of the program looked promising. In 1965, NSC under President Kyser signed an agreement with the department of Army stating that the Military Science Senior ROTC program would be provided with a university secretary, armory, and utilities.

The NSU ROTC Department and the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana mutually support Cadet Command by identifying quality soldiers with officer potential and in assisting them in transition from active duty under the college ROTC Green to Gold program.

The NSU ROTC Demon Battalion has commissioned over 1000 Second Lieutenants in to the United States Armed Services. Quite a few graduates have become distinguished Army Officers, including several General Officers.

A Hall of Fame was begun in 1983. Portraits and biographies of the Hall of Fame members are on permanent display in the ROTC office foyer.

Notably, five NSU ROTC commissioned officers have been inducted into NSU's highest Hall of Distinction, the Long Purple Line.
