PROGRAM NAME: 19A-631 Northwestern State University of Louisiana

PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION:

1. **K Increase the fall headcount enrollment by 7.25% from the baseline level of 9,324 in fall 2015 to 10,000 by fall 2020.**

The data are submitted by the colleges twice annually, at the end of the fall and spring semesters of an academic year. For this indicator, the fall data (the national standard) will be used. The indicator will be reported at the end of the fourth quarter. This will allow time for collection, aggregation, and editing of the data.

This graduation rate is calculated using institutionally reported data to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). The number of reported cohort completers is divided by the total revised cohort (with allowable exclusions). The indicator will be reported at the end of the fourth quarter. This will allow time for collection, aggregation, and editing of the data.
