In AC 2019-2020 the target was not met, although result approached benchmark. The cumulative mean decreased by 9.2% from the AC 2018-19 administration of the assessment with a cumulative mean of 75.02%. Scores from the AC 2019-2020 administration were less consistent with a 18.05% standard deviation versus 11.6%, but the percentage of students who scored above benchmark remained the same and showed that most students (56%) scored above benchmark. The drop in the overall mean of the scores can be partially attributed to the one very low outlier score of 38%. Without this score the remainder of the class averaged 79%, which is very close to benchmark. AC 2019-2020 administration was scored using a detailed rubric.

Based on the analysis of the AC 2019-2020 data, faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement.
