



Funds are requested to purchase Meti BabySim, the only patient simulator that employs multiple models of human physiology. Sophisticated mathematical models of human physiology and pharmacology automatically determine the patient's response to user actions and interventions. This simulator will enable the nursing clinical students to have access to simulators ranging from adult, young child, and the BabySim. The BabySim interacts with the learners and automatically responds to clinical interventions in a physiologically appropriate manner.

3. State measurable objectives that will be used to determine the impact/effectiveness of the project.

The measurable objectives are determined by the results that students receive from having access

to a model that responds to user actions and interventions. Students are guided by their clinical professor; the patient outcome is the result of clinical interventions, and provides a platform for objective performance assessment by the clinical instructor.

The BabySim interacts with the learner and automatically responds to the clinical interventions in an physiologically appropriate way, and provides a platform for objective performance assessment.

All Clinical instructors will have access to these assessment tools in the clinical setting in our Warrington Simulator labs.

- a. Alarm limits with accompanying sounds can be configured for each parameter.
 - b. When pulse/heart rate is monitored, an accompanying sound is played in synchrony with the cardiac cycle, as monitored by the ECG, arterial blood pressure, or SpO₂.



The safety of NSU students, faculty, staff, and NSU Child and Family Network students and clients is one of the objectives of installing this equipment. The purpose for this project was to provide accessibility to program offerings through the use of video conferencing capability. Northwestern delivers academic and other services to an expansive geographic area within the northern and central sectors of Louisiana. Satellite campuses are located in Shreveport, Leesville and Alexandria, and additional sites extend to BPCC, Ferriday, the Rapides Hospital, and Barksdale (August 2010). Course offerings are also made via the technology to dual enrollment students located in Sabine Parish currently with the planned addition of Vernon Parish. The University is making a significant commitment to achieve the delivery of the programs to these rural sites.

Funding for this project will be used to serve the needs of the students who enroll in compressed video courses. Overall electronic enrollment numbers continue to increase annually when compared to previous semesters, and the enhanced facility provides students with similar educational opportunities as afforded to traditional face-to-face students.

The compressed video equipment provides a site in which students may receive classes which may otherwise be unavailable. As of a result of the support from Student Technology allocations Northwestern State University has been able to provide additional learning opportunities for students through electronic delivery. The existing video conferencing equipment in these rooms is based on decade old architecture. This project would allow the university to upgrade the equipment in support of the move to a truly IP environment which would at some point allow the use of true high definition (HD). The move from a substandard definition to HD would allow the university to more fully expand upon the existing infrastructure and provide a more up-to-date learning experience for students. This project would also provide an opportunity to capture video through an RSS that can be incorporated into a system that allows for the combination of both synchronous and asynchronous learning. This blended model is supported as a means of more fully adapting content to the needs of learners through the expansion of hardware and software.

Student Impact:

In the Fall of 2009 104 sections were offered via video conferencing and 45 unique courses which generated 1,270 enrollments. 

The new test proctoring initiative provides an expanded Testing Center with services to NSU currently enrolled students, faculty and staff.

2. Describe project/initiative for which you are requesting funds.

The development of an expanded Testing Center on the Natchitoches Campus will allow NSU to provide computer-based test proctoring for students enrolled in online courses and computer-based test administration for Northwestern Students required to take various standardized tests. The Testing Centers differs from the Disability Center that offers testing accommodations to students will a documented disability. Ensuring that online education yields quality results and maximum benefits for students, NSU must effectively allocate resources to initiatives that invest in assisting online students. The expanded Testing Center is a new initiative that will assist in meeting the challenge of producing quality education at a distance. At present, NSU has no dedicated space for testing students who are enrolled in online courses. Many professors who teach online courses require tests to be proctored. The pool of available proctors is limited, especially in rural areas. Additionally, if a proctor is available, cost is another obstacle to obtaining services. The expanded Testing Center will offer numerous benefits including proctoring for online exams.

This initiative was originally birthed via a National Association of System Heads (NASH) grant, \$90,000 of which is now available for infrastructure to partially fund the project. The initial proposal of the NASH grant intended funding from several sources, including University Student Technology Special Initiative. The funds awarded by the NASH grant will cover the required wiring/networking needs to accommodate the new computer lab, student tables, and furniture throughout the center. The Student Technology Fee Special Initiative will assist with furnishing computers for the centers; however, grant funding maybe requested if additional needs for the centers arise during the planning and implementation phase.

1. In the first year, the Testing Center expects to provide test proctoring for as many as 4500 tests for approximately 1500 NSU students enrolled in online course(s).



All students at Northwestern State University including all branch campuses and all distance-learning students from freshmen to graduate students.

Due to projected 35% budget shortfall, Watson Library will probably be unable to continue some of the services provided in the past. This includes the Project Muse database and our membership in Amigos, which enables the library to catalog materials and locate materials for Interlibrary Loan.

Students have been requesting this database via student surveys and the library has been only recently able to provide access on a limited basis.</p> <p>Amigos is a regional consortium which enables libraries to see what other libraries hold books, journals, etc. available for interlibrary loan. (This is different from LOUIS, which provides the software—Illiad—which powers the interlibrary loan system.</p> <p>Amigos also provides access to catalog records which enables Watson Library to catalog all materials including eBooks faster and more accurately by doing copy cataloging. This is especially cost effective to catalog gift materials.</p>

Project Muse is verified using EZ Proxy so only students who have access to library materials may use it.

I was never told what the split was going to be. Some money was taken out of the library budget and we assumed it was LOUIS but I don't know for sure.

Our capital outlay was reduced about \$40,000 from the amount we were originally told, but again I don't know for sure that was LOUIS. I do know the library could not afford a equal three way split between the library, efee, and tech fee without cutting our journals severly. I think efee paid closer to half the amount. (Remember the amount we paid this year was only 10 months since the BOR paid for July and August and LOUIS also dropped about half a dozen databases). For ten months, our total LOUIS bill was \$126,891—the full amount for 12 months with no cuts was \$170,000. The figure I gave you was based on the \$170,000 figure with a 10% inflation raise and some wiggle room in case libraries have to drop out and the price goes up.

Frankly, as long as we kept LOUIS and the library kept some of its budget, I didn't really worry about it.

Of course, next year, I would not guarantee that the library will even have \$40,000. When I did the budget reduction exercise we were asked to do and by eliminating all the operating, supply, and capital outlay money—zeroed out journals, LOUIS, Amigos, everything—it was still not enough to meet the 35% without eliminating some salaries.

Next meeting will be set at a later date.


