- Copyright– numbered with *ii* (All subsequent preliminary pages are numbered with lower-case Roman numerals, bottom-center of page), use template
- Dedication or Acknowledgements optional, numbered (No more than two pages in length)
- Abstract numbered, use template
- Table of Contents numbered, use template
- List of Tables and/or Figures numbered, format same as TOC, list by table/figure number and name (e.g., Table 1. Classifications of Diversity).
- Chapter 1 Introduction to the Study (Begin with page 1 in upper-right corner, no running head)
 - Background
 - Statement of the Problem
 - Conceptual/Theoretical Basis for the Study
 - Purpose of the Study
 - Research Questions (1...2....3....n)
 - Hypotheses (1...2...3...n)
 - Significance of the Study
