

- The Technical Assistance Center continues to deploy laptops to faculty and staff. Please send any requests for devices or check of status to either Tracy Brown or Joshua Garner.
- Interviews for the TAC Lead positions underway. The committee plans to meet early this week to make its recommendation.
- ITS plans for the campus Wi-Fi upgrade project to soon move to a procurement stage. This project will replace nearly 600 wireless access points, two wireless controllers, and authentication servers. The new wireless network supports the latest in Wi-Fi 6 wireless standards. The current wireless environment is a mixture of AC and N wireless standards, which is two and three generations behind.
