HIST 3990: Historical Methods

Measure 1.1.

Students enrolled in HIST 4000 (a required course for all history majors) must complete a 15-page research paper on a topic of their choice in either US or non-US history. The project requires an understanding and reading of primary and secondary sources. Students must demonstrate sufficient comprehension of the subject they research as well as the historiography of that subject. Eighty percent (80%) of students enrolled will earn a grade of C or better on the research paper assignment.

Finding: Target met.

Analysis: In AC 2019-2020, the target was met. Based on the analysis of the 2019-2020 results the faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement. The program, in keeping with the university goals of implementing QEP experiential learning implemented changes to the degree program beginning in academic year 2020-2021. HIST 3000 replaced SST 1030 as a new junior level "Historian's Craft" class. HIST 4000 entitled "History Research Methods" replaced the senior capstone class HIST 3990.

As a result of these changes, in AC 2020-2021, the target was met. Eighty-three percent (20/24) of students earned a C or better.

Decision: In AC 2020-2021 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2020-2021 results the faculty will implement the following changes in AC 2021-2022 to drive the cycle of improvement. Students in HIST 4000 will be required to conduct a research

consultation with NSU Watson Library staff as part of the requirements for the class. In addition, each student will be assigned a "faculty mentor" in the department who will engage in regular face to face or virtual meetings to discuss the ongoing research and writing process during the course of the semester. The mentoring process will help ensure continued achievement of the department's benchmark as well as ensuring a higher completer rate for each cohort of the Capstone class.

Changes for the HIST 4000 class will improve the student's ability to understand the nature and methodology of history. Instructors will demonstrate to students how to master the process of historical research. Students will understand how historians think about and do history; specifically theoretical perspectives, practice, and the writing of history. The overall objective of the methods course is to provide students with the information, the skills, and the tools they will need to be active members of the history profession. Data collected from HIST 4000 will continue to push the cycle of improvement forward.

Measure: 2.1.

All history majors are required to take HIST 1010, 1020, 2010, and 2020, which provide an opportunity for students to acquire foundational knowledge and understanding of the major events and developments that have shaped the US and world history. **Beginning** *in Fall of 2017*, the program assessed foundational knowledge of major historical events through a capstone exam required of all students enrolled in History 3990 – required for graduation. Seventy-five percent (75%) of students enrolled in each course will earn a composite grade of C (70%) or higher on each of the four sections of the capstone exam specifically related to this measure.

Finding: Target met.

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Analysis: In AC 2019-2020, the target was not met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2019-2020 results, the faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement. The faculty redrafted questions in underperforming sections of the capstone exam. Faculty members consulted and determined if content across different course sections is consistent and determined if any capstone questions require replacement.

As a result of these changes, in AC 2020-2021, the target was met. Ninety-two percent (22/24) of students achieved the target in Part One, ninety-six percent (23/24) of students achieved the target in Part Two, eighty-eight percent (21/24) of students achieved the target in Part Three, and seventy-five percent (18/24) of students achieved the target in Part Four.

Decision: In AC 2020-2021 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2020-2021 results, the faculty will implement the following changes in AC 2021-2022 to drive the cycle of improvement. The faculty will amend questions in current underperforming sections of the capstone exam. Faculty members will replace redundant or extraneous questions in the capstone exam to streamline the studying process.

Measure: 2.2.

Students enrolled in HIST 4000 (a required course for all history majors) must complete a 15-page research paper on a topic of their choice in either US or non-US history. The project requires an understanding and reading of primary and secondary sources. Students must demonstrate sufficient comprehension of the subject they research as well as the historiography of that subject. Eighty percent (80%) of students enrolled will earn a grade of C or better on the research paper assignment.

Measure 3.1.

All history majors must take HIST 3000 after completing four (4) required intro history classes. Students enrolled in this course are required to distinguish between primary and secondary sources and must complete written assignments based on their understanding of these kinds of historical texts. Seventy-five percent (75%) of students enrolled will earn a grade of C on the written exam which specifically assesses this SLO.

Finding: Target not met.

Analysis: In 2019-2020 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2019-2020 results the faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement. In Fall of 2020, the department reorganized the curriculum in order to comply with the QEP experiential learning requirements. One change replaced the SST 1030 class with HIST 3000. HIST 3000 has been moved to the third year of study in order for students to complete 4 of the intro History classes.

As a result of these changes, in AC 2020-2021, the target was not met. Sixty percent

(9/15) of students earned a C or better.

Measure 4.1.

All history majors must take HIST 3000 after completing four (4) required intro history classes. Students enrolled in this course are required to distinguish between primary and secondary sources and must complete an archival assignment based on their understanding of these kinds of historical texts. Seventy-five percent (75%) of students enrolled will earn a grade of C or better on the assignment.

Finding: Target not met.

Analysis: In 2019-2020 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2019-2020 results the faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement. In Fall of 2020, the department reorganized the curriculum in order to comply with the QEP experiential learning requirements. One change replaced the SST 1030 class with HIST 3000. HIST 3000 has been moved to the third year of study in order for students to complete 4 of the intro History classes.

As a result of these changes, in AC 2020-2021, the target was not met. Sixty percent (9/15) of students earned a C or better.

Students enrolled in HIST 3000 must complete a Thesis and Citation assignment that directly assesses this SLO. Seventy-five percent (75%) of students enrolled will earn a grade of C or higher on the assignment.

Finding: Target met.

Analysis: In AC 2019-2020 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2019-2020 results the faculty implemented the following changes in AC 2020-2021 to drive the cycle of improvement. In Fall of 2020, the department reorganized the curriculum in order to comply with the QEP experiential learning requirements. One change will replace the SST 1030 class with HIST 3000. HIST 3000 has been moved to the third year of study in order for students to complete 4 of the intro History classes.

As a result of these changes, in AC 2020-2021 the target was met. One hundred percent (13/13) of students earned a C or better.

Decision: In AC 2020-2021 the target was met. Based on the analysis of the AC 2020-2021 results the faculty will implement the following changes in AC 2021-2022 to drive the cycle of improvement. The instructor will add a new text that focuses on citation and annotation methods as an introduction to the research and writing process. The new style guide textbook will be part of a re-tooled class which spends an entire five-week module on citation and archival assignments along with reading and writing specifically geared to the history degree.

Students enrolled in HIST 4000 (a required course for all history majors) must complete a 15-page research paper on a topic of their choice in either US or non-US history. The project requires an understanding and reading of primary and secondary sources.

Based on an analysis of the 2019-2020 data, the following changes were implemented in 2020-2021:

- HIST 4000 entitled "History Research Methods" replaced the senior capstone class HIST 3990.
- The faculty redrafted questions in underperforming sections of the capstone exam.
- Faculty members consulted and determined if content across different course sections is consistent and determined if any capstone questions require replacement.
- SST 1030 class was replaced with HIST 3000. HIST 3000 has been moved to the third year of study in order for students to complete 4 of the intro History classes.

Plan of Action Moving Forward:

The department continues to more clearly evaluate student performance with the implementation of the following during AC 2021-2022

- Students in HIST 4000 will be required to conduct a research consultation with NSU Watson Library staff as part of the requirements for the class.
- Each student will be assigned a "faculty mentor" in the department who will engage in regular face to face or virtual meetings to discuss the ongoing research and writing process during the course of the semester.
- The faculty will amend questions in current underperforming sections of the capstone exam.
- Faculty members will replace redundant or extraneous questions in the capstone exam to streamline the studying process.
- The instructor will add a new text that focuses on citation and annotation methods as an introduction to the research and writing process.
