I. Department of Criminal Justice, History, Social Sciences

- Make the following changes to the History (261) degree program:
 - Change major requirements to read:

(51 semester hours) Students seeking a major in History must complete 51 semester hours within the 120 semester hour History curriculum, which include History 1010, 1020, 2010, 2020, 3990, SST1030 and 21 semester hours of advanced history courses within the chosen concentration, and 6 semester hours in the other. Students must also complete 6 hours of a foreign language.

- Add the following concentrations (see proposal for specific requirements):
 - American History (261A)
 - European/World History (261B)
- Make the following changes to the curriculum:
 - 1st year delete GEOG 1010, Mathematics¹ (3 hours); add HIST 2010, 2020.
 - 2nd year delete electives² (6 hours), HIST 2010, 2020; add History Concentration (9 hours), Mathematics1 (3 hours), GEOG 1010.
 - 3rd year delete electives² (3 hours), history electives (9 hours); add History Concentration (12 hours).
 - 4th year delete 3 hours electives², 3 hours history electives, SST 4020; add History Concentration (6 hours).

• Delete footnote #2: *The electives must be chosen so as to complete a minor as defined by the department concerned.*

Action: All items approved without opposition.

II. School of Creative and Performing Arts

- Make the following changes to the Art (511) degree program:
 - Delete ART 5150 and 5410 from the options to satisfy the degree.
 - Delete footnote #3: May be repeated for a total of 9 hours credit when topic varies.

Action: Approved without opposition.

III. Louisiana Scholars' College

- Add the following new courses for undergraduate credit:
 - SGRK 4890 Advanced Reading in Greek (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SHIS 4890 Advanced Reading in History (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SHUM 4890 Advanced Reading in Humanities (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SLTN 4890 Advanced Reading in Latin (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SLSC 4890 Advanced Reading in Interdisciplinary Studies (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SPHI 4890 Advanced Reading in Philosophy (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
 - SSCI 4890 Advanced Reading in Science (1 to 4-1 to 4-0).
- Make the following changes to the History (858) joint major program:
 - Change major requirements to read:
 - History (858): support courses: SLSC 4000, SHUM 480T, SHUM 482T; major courses (42 semester hours) HIST 2010, 2020, 3990, and 21 semester hours of advanced history courses within the chosen concentration, and 6 semester hours in the other. Students must also complete 6 hours of a foreign language.
 - Add the following concentrations (see proposal for specific requirements):
 - American History (261A) (858A)
 - European/World History (261B) (858B)
 - Make the following <u>changes to the curriculum</u>:
 - 4th year delete SST 4020, SHIS/HIST courses (9 hours); add SHIS/HIST Courses for concentration (12 hours).
 - Revise footnote #1 to read; At least 10 hours of Academic Electives should be courses with Scholars' prefixes.

- Delete footnote # 2: *Student must take two of one discipline (life or physical science) and one semester of the other.*
- Add a new joint major in Industrial Engineering Technology (see proposal for specific requirements).

<u>Action:</u> Dr. T. Davina McClain, for the Louisiana Scholars' College, requested a correction to the agenda of the proposed concentration codes (261A/B to 858 A/B) (see correction above). Request approved. All items approved without opposition.

Other Business:

Mrs. Lillie Frazier Bell, University Registrar, requested the council consider adding the following to the Curriculum Review Council Procedural Guidelines, effect immediately. Ms. Bell explained the additional guidelines are being presented on the recommendation of the Banner consultants in response to Banner system mandates.

CHANGES THAT CAN BE DONE AT ANY TIME DURING THE ACADEMIC CALENDAR YEAR:

- 1. Adding new courses to the catalog
- 2. Adding new courses to the schedule
- 3. Adding a new curriculum
- 4. Adding a new department for courses
- 5. Adding a new college for courses

CHANGES THAT MUST BE DONE IN THE <u>NEXT</u> ACADEMIC CALENDAR YEAR ONCE EARLY REGISTRATION BEGINS:

- 1. Changing existing departments
- 2. Changing existing colleges
- 3. Changing existing majors, concentration, and minors
- 4. Renumbering existing Courses
- 5. Changing existing Course Subjects (For example: prefix SPS to SAHE, PE to HP, OR to UNIV, NURS to NA, RADS to NA, etc.).

(Ellucian's Consultants highly recommended that we do not make changes to existing course subjects until the next academic calendar year).

6. In addition, it was recommended that we do not reuse a previously existing course number or not reuse the course number for at least 6 years)
