## I. Department of English, Foreign Languages, and Cultural Studies

- A. Make the following change to the University core:
  - Require a minimum passing grade of "C" for the English and Literature components of the University core (i.e., ENGL 1010, 1020, 2070 or 2110).
- B. Replace the statement published on page 170 and 173 with the following to include ENGL 1011 as a course in which a grade of "C" or better is required to enroll in advanced-level ENGL courses:
  - Students must earn a C or better in ENGL 1010, 1011 (if required), 1020, and the sophomore literature course(s) in order to be eligible to enroll in advanced-level ENGL courses.
- C. Require a minimum passing grade of "C" for the English (221) major core (i.e., ENGL 1010, 1020, 2070, 2110).

<u>ACTION</u>: Based on opposition presented to the council by Dr. Frank Serio all items tabled by a majority vote of the council to allow for further review and discussion.

# II. Department of Engineering Technology

- A. Add the following <u>new concentration</u> to the Engineering Technology (140) curriculum:
  - Advanced Manufacturing (140C): (33 semester hours): Electronics Engineering Technology 1300-1301, 1320-21, 1330-31, 2320-21, 3320; Industrial Engineering Technology 1020, 1400, 2020, 2400, 2920.
- B. Add the following to the Electronics (140A) concentration:
  - EET 1311, IET 1700, and MATH 2020.
- C. Add the following to the Industrial (140B) concentration:
  - EET 1311, IET 1020, IET 1700, and MATH 2020.
- D. Make the following changes to the Engineering Technology (140) curriculum:

#### 1st Year:

- Delete CHEM 1030; EET 1311; ET concentration area (12 hours); IET 1700.
- o Add Physical Science1; ET concentration area (14-21 hours).

#### 2nd Year:

- Delete: ET concentration area (14-15 hours); MATH 2020; PHYSICS 2030-2031.
- o Add: COMM 1010; ET concentration area (12-21 hours); SCI 1020.
