## I. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE, HISTORY AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

A. Add the following Undergraduate Certificate offered through the Department of Criminal Justice, History and Social Sciences:

- Remote Systems Science and Technology

B. Add the following new course for undergraduate credit:

- RSST 2010 – Introduction to Remote Systems Science and Technology (3-2-1).
- RSST 3010 – Remote Systems Operations, Law and Policy (2-2-0).
- RSST 4010 – Advanced Remote Systems Science and Technology (3-2-1).
- CJ 3900 – Survey of Criminal Justice Research (3-3-0).

However, students seeking the Pre-Law and Paralegal***

*Studies Concentration will take PLPS 4020 in lieu of CJ 4200 and PLPS 4090 in lieu of CJ 4480.*

- C. Make the following changes to the Electronics Engineering Technology Joint Major (843) program:
- Revise major requirements to read:

***Electronics Engineering Technology Joint Major Requirements:*** (63-66 semester hours) Students seeking a major in Electronics Engineering Technology must complete 63-66 semester hours, within the 130 semester hour Electronics Engineering Technology curriculum, which include the ~~44~~ **46** semester hour Electronics Engineering Technology core and a ~~19-22~~ **20-22** semester hour concentration.

- Revise core requirements to read:  
**Core:** (44 ~~46~~ semester hours) Electronics Engineering Technology 1300-1301, **1311**, 1320-1321, 1330-1331, 2320-2321, **2330-2331**, 3310-3311, 3340-3341, 3360-3361, 4300-4301, 4390, ~~4900~~, 4940; Industrial Engineering Technology 1400, 1700.
- Revise concentration requirements to read:  
**Electronics (843A):** (~~19~~ **20** semester hours): Electronics Engineering Technology 4310-4311, 4350-4351, 4950; Industrial Engineering Technology 2790, 3740; and three additional hours of technical electives.

**Industrial Engineering Technology Joint Major Requirements:** (64 semester hours) Students seeking a major in Industrial Engineering Technology must complete 64 semester hours, within the 131 semester hour Industrial Engineering Technology curriculum, which include Electronics Engineering Technology 1300-1301, **1311**, 1320-1321, 4940; Industrial Engineering Technology ~~1020~~, 1400, 1700, 1800, 2020, ~~2400~~, ~~2740~~, 2790, 3150, 3510, ~~3550~~, 3570, 3740, **3900**, 4700, 4720, 4730, **4820, 4890**, ~~4900~~, 4960 or **EET 4950**; and ~~three~~ **six** hours of electives from any Industrial Engineering Technology or Electronics Engineering Technology courses.
- Curriculum:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> year:
    - Add: EET 1300, 1301, 1311.
    - Delete: IET 1020, 2400.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> year:
    - Delete: EET 1300, 1301.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> year:
    - Add: IET 1080 as an option to CSC 1080; IET 3900, 4820; 3 hours of IET electives.
    - Delete: IET 2740.



- 4<sup>th</sup> year:
  - Correct: EET 4940 (change hour value to 3 hours).
  - Add: EET 4950 as an option to IET 4960.

E. Make the following changes to the History Joint Major (858) program:

- Revise major requirements to read:

**History Joint Major Requirements:** support courses: SLSC 4000, SHUM 480T, SHUM 482T; twelve hours in a single foreign language; major courses – HIST 2010, 2020, 3000, ~~3990~~, 4000, ~~SST 4020~~, and 24 semester hours of advanced American and European/non-American History courses (SHUM or HIST) - twelve hours in one field and twelve hours in the other. Academic electives – 14 hours (8 hours must be from courses with Scholars' prefixes).




